Ned H. Dearborn, council president, said it was possible the actual number killed in highway traffic may be 50 to 100 lower than the estimate. He warned against a "surge of carelessness" by weary motorists intent on ticking off the last few miles home.

"Experience has shown," he said, "that the final day of a holiday recreation period is usually the most costly in terms of accidental death and injury. It is then that the traffic is heaviest and the driver is most irritable. Irritability causes many accidents."
