offset losses in bad years against profits in good years, and less stringent accounting requirements.

Most of the tax cuts would take effect as of Jan. 1, 1954, and would show up in returns filed next spring. The revenue reductions would mount in future years. No overall estimates of future effects are available, although some Democrats argue the revenue loss will mount above \$2,000,000,000.

Representative Reed of New York, chairman of the tax-writing ways and means committee, told the House passage of the program would signal a green light for expansion of the national economy.

Representative Cooper of Tennessee, senior Democrat on the tax committee, insisted "it is wrong" to give more favorable tax treatment for dividend income than for workers' income earned in wages and salaries.

Cooper declared the revision bill does not provide enough relief for low-income persons.
