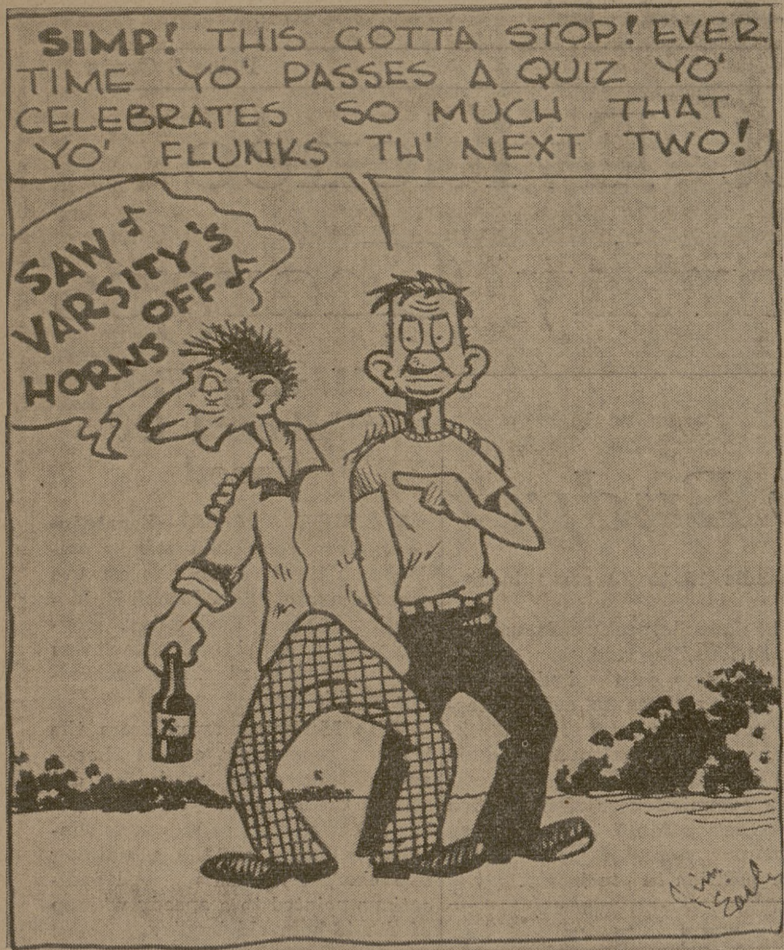

7 Cases Reported For Strep Throat

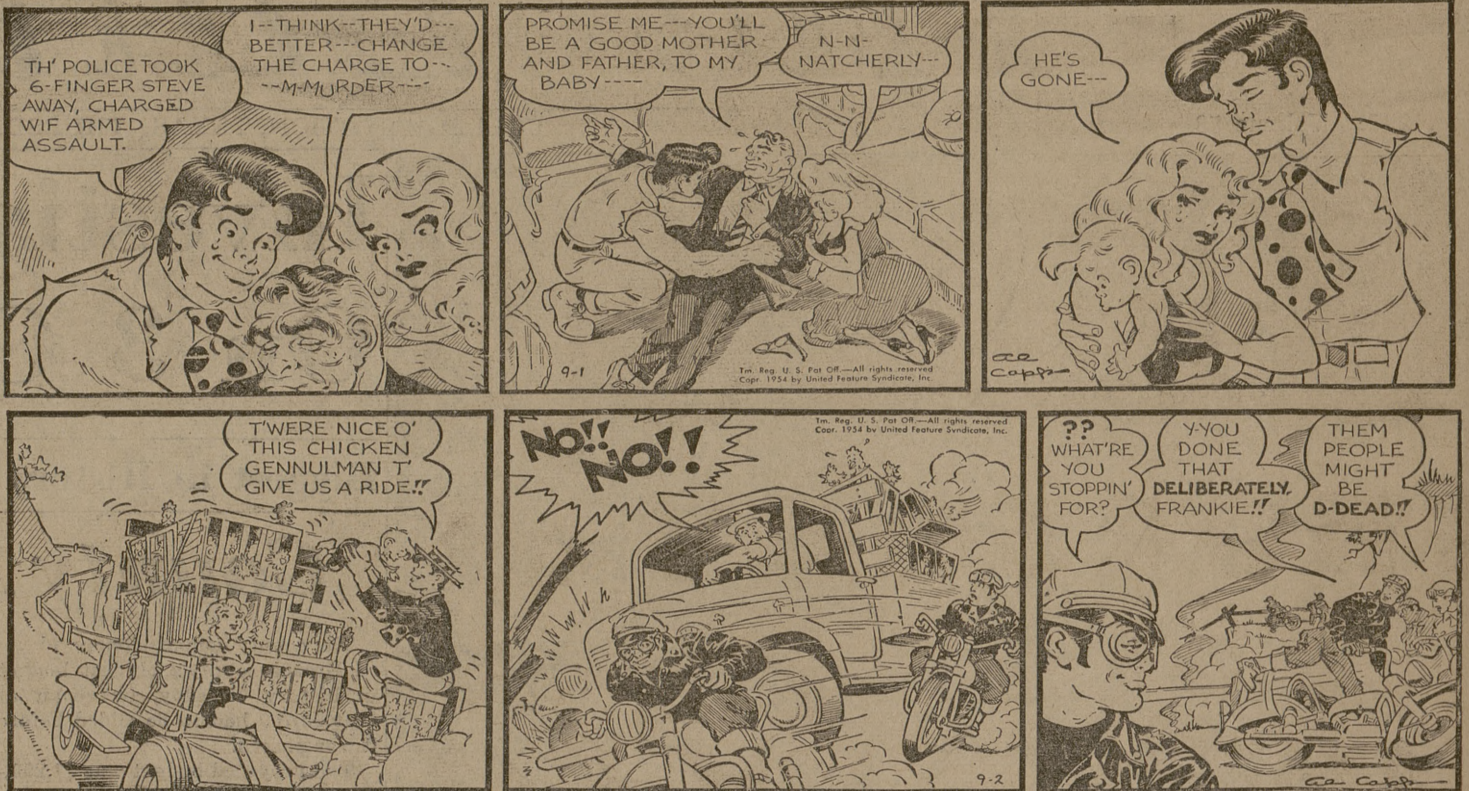
College Station reported seven cases of strep throat last week, according to the Bryan-Brazos county health unit. Bryan reported four cases, for a total of 11.

Former Student Gets Navy Rank

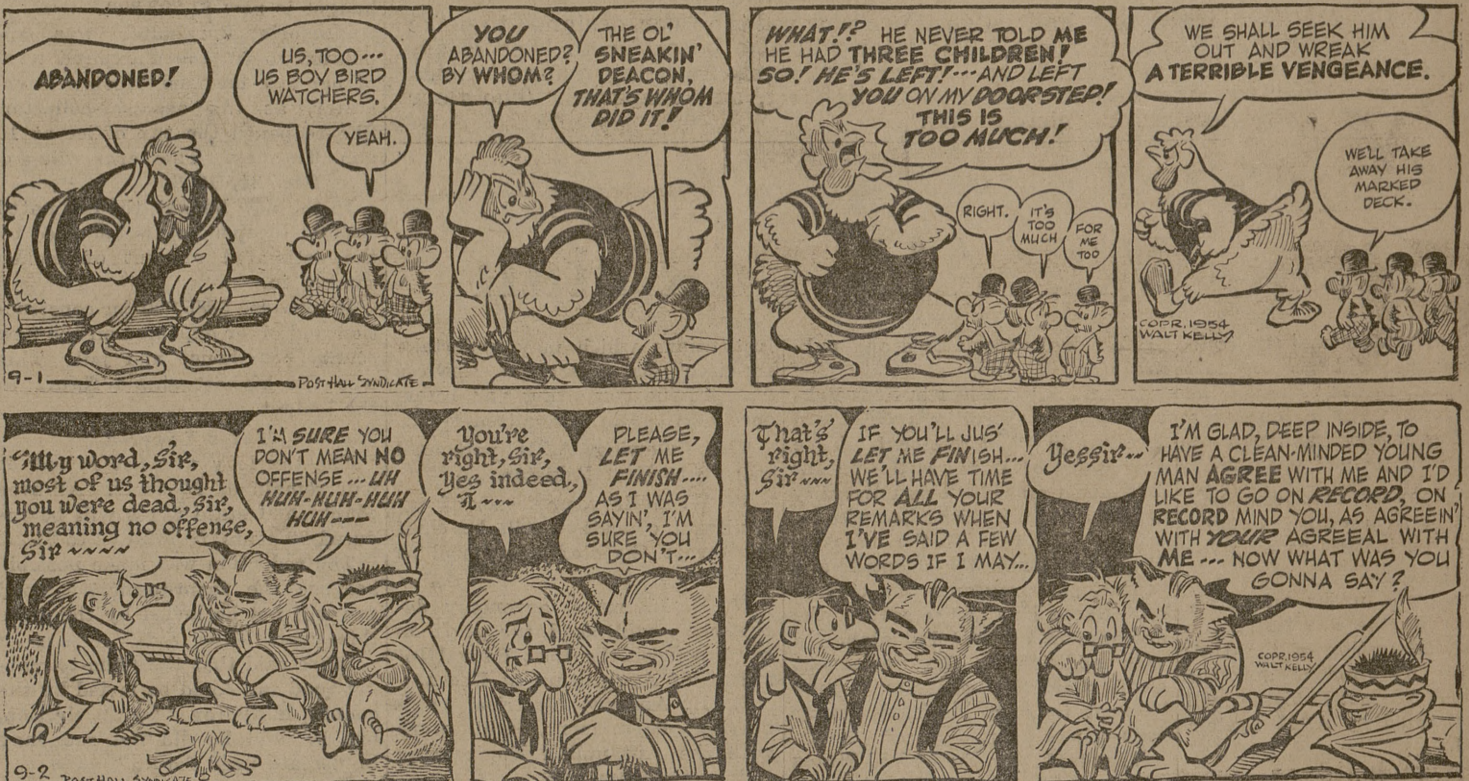
