#### New Gym Will Be Ready This Fall

The proposed addition to the G. Rollie White coliseum will open during the fall term of 1955, said C. E. Tishler, head of the physical education department.

The new addition, which will join the rear of the main building, is the physical education and intermural arthletics.


"We will have the facilities for handling 1,000 students per hour,' Tishler said. "We have had about 3,000 students each fall semester for the past three years. Howere, when our proposed physical education facilities are completed, we can handle approximately double that amount."

One of the outstanding features of the new coliseum wing, according to Tishler, will be the small corrective gymnasium on the ground floor. "Formerly, students with physical handicaps could not participate in many types of sports but with the cooperation of their family doctors and the college hospital, students will have the opportunity to take part in modified sports," said Tishler.

The second floor of the building will have rooms for different kinds of indoor sports. Wrestling, fencing, and boxing rooms are pro-
