in 1954 from Southern Arkansas State college of Magnolia. During his eight-year span there his teams won 54, lost 27 and tied two. He won two Arkansas Intercollegiate titles in '51-'52.

A graduate of Danville, Ark., high, Smith, 46, was a four-year, four sport letterman at Hendrix College, Conway, Ark., graduating in 1931.

He served his alma mater as assistant until 1936 when he went to Centenary. Served in the navy and discharged a lieutenant commander. He served at Athens, Ga., Jacksonville and Elizabeth City, N.J.

TOM TIPPS, a graduate of Sull Ross college, has one of the outstanding high school coaching records in Texas.

Prior to joining the Aggie staff in the spring of 1954, Tipps, 38, was head coach at Pampa for seven years. He won 56, lost 50 and tied one in the "little Southwest conference" AAAA prep league.

Tipps coached at Seagraves and Temple high schools before World War II, then after 3½ years in the infantry served at Denton before going to Pampa in 1947.

CHARLES E. "SMOKEY" HARPER is new athletic trainer at Texas A&M. A veteran—he's been in the business since 1926—Smokey is one of the most colorful trainers in the nation.

A graduate of Mercer college in Macon, Georgia, Smokey has served as trainer at Clemson, Vanderbilt, Florida, Alabama, UCLA and Kentucky before coming to A&M with Bryant this past February.

LOU KARIBO, spring graduate of Kentucky and a varsity back for the past three seasons, became the ninth member of the Aggie football staff. He was added during fall practice.

Karibo is 22 years old. He will work on his master's degree here in addition to his football duties.
