Choir practice will start at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday at the A&M Methodist church.

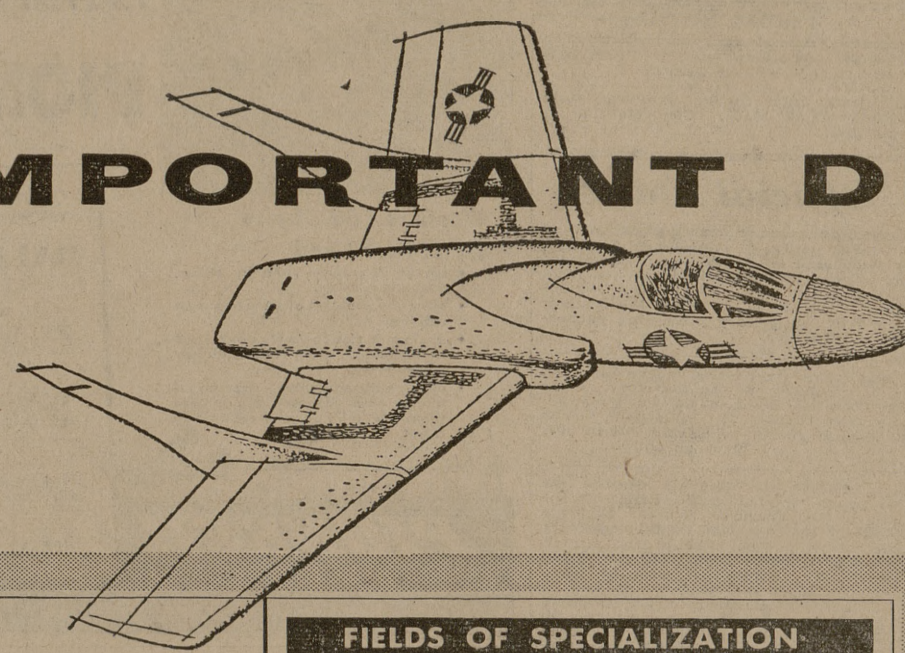
