SHRIMP CREOLE

Cook in two tablespoons of margarine and one large onion (chopped) and blend in
 2 tablespoons flour 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
 1 can tomato paste 1/4 cup chopped green pepper
 3 cups water Salt and pepper
 1/4 cup diced celery
 1/2 teaspoon garlic salt
 Let simmer for 30-45 minutes. Stir in 1 pound of cooked shrimp. Serve over hot, flaky rice.

BOILED SHRIMP

Plunge one pound shrimp into generous amount of rapidly boiling salted water. Add one bay leaf. Put a piece of bread on the top of the water to absorb the odor. Cook about 15 minutes or until shells turn pink. Drain and rinse with cold water. Remove shell, legs and the black line that runs down the back.

ICE BOX ROLLS

1/2 cup shortening 1 egg
 1 tablespoon salt 1 fresh yeast cake softened in small amount of water
 1/3 cup sugar 4 cups flour
 1/2 cup boiling water
 1/2 cup cold water
 Mix shortening and sugar. Pour in the hot water and stir until shortening is only partly melted. Add cold water. Sift in one cup of flour and salt. Mix in the egg and dissolved yeast. Sift in the remaining amount of flour. Place dough in a greased mixing bowl and place in the ice box until you are ready to roll out. Roll out and let rise one hour before baking in a hot oven for about 20 minutes.

ICE BOX COOKIES

1 cup shortening 2 teaspoons baking powder
 1 cup brown sugar 1/2 teaspoon salt
 1 cup granulated sugar Vanilla
 2 eggs 1 cup floured nuts
 Sift in: 3 1/2 cups flour
 Wrap in wax paper and store in ice box until ready to bake. Slice thin, sprinkle green and red colored sugar crystals on top for Christmas. Bake on greased cookie sheet in hot oven (425 degrees) for 10 minutes.
