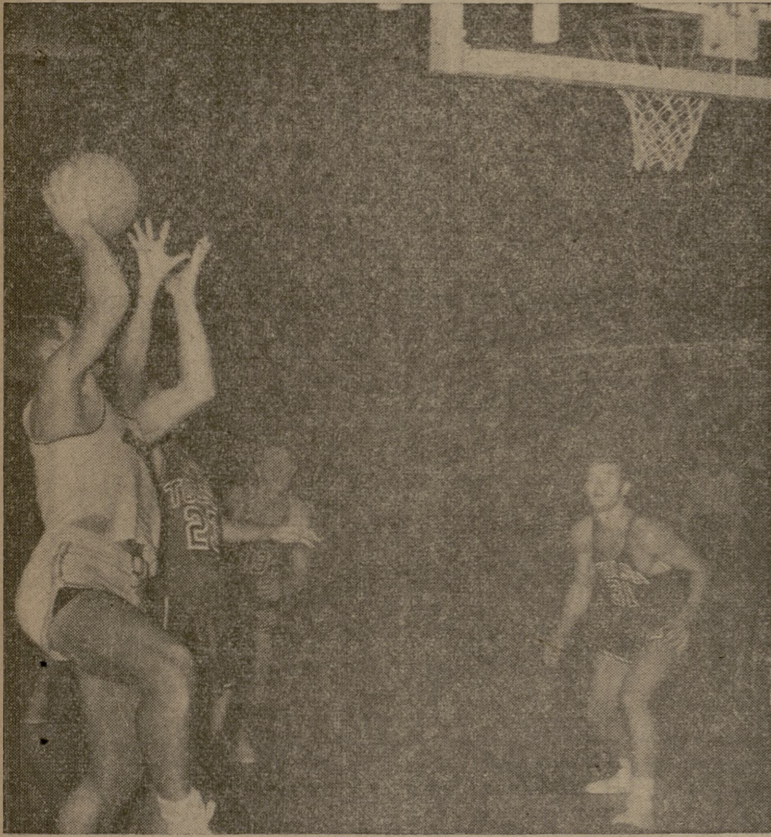


# Trio Stars As Fish Beat Arlington State

A trio of players led the Aggie freshmen over the Arlington State Rebels here last night, 63-48. Ted Dockery, Fritzie Connley, and Bryan Sutherland sparked the Fish attack by scoring 49 points

between them. The Fish play Allen Academy tonight at 8 p.m. in Bryan. Dockery, a 6-5 forward, was high point man for the Aggies with 18 points. Sixteen of them came on field goals.

Center Connley was second in scoring with 16 points, and played an outstanding game defensively, getting 12 rebounds. Connley will complete his freshman year at A&M in January, and will be eligible for the varsity next semester.

Sutherland, another forward, scored 15 points and was second in rebounds with nine. Guard Wendell Stotts was the top scorer for Arlington with 14 points, all of them coming on field goals.

The first half was a close battle that saw the lead change hands three times, and end up with the Aggies on the long end of a 29-27 score. Connley was the leading scorer in the first half with 10 points.
