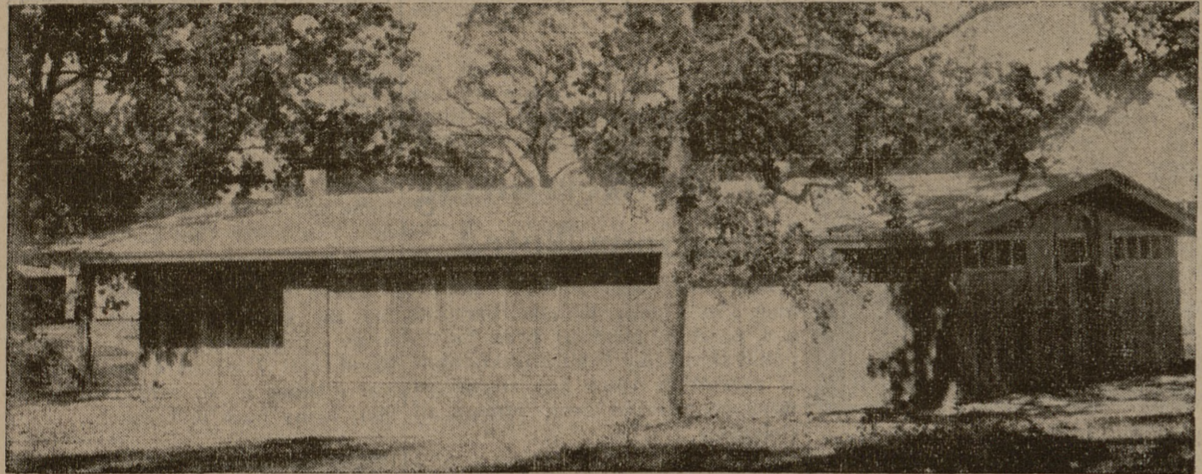

Parsonage Opening Set

The new parsonage of the A&M Wesley foundation will be officially opened Sunday at 2:30 p.m. with a consecration service led by Dr. W. R. Swain, superintendent of

Bryan Methodist district. The parsonage is a dream of the former director, the Rev. R. C. Sneed. The Rev. Robert C. Monk, present director and his wife will

reside in the new parsonage. Interested groups and individuals have made it possible through gifts which were channeled through the foundation's board of directors to build the home.

Located at 700 Inlow blvd. in College Station, it was constructed at a cost of \$14,500. The home was designed and built by the Dale Construction company of College Station.

Included in the home is a living and dining room area which can provide space for group parties and suppers for the students. Other features are a fireplace, a combination study and sitting room, two bedrooms and two baths.

The Rev. Sterling Wheeler of Austin, Texas Methodist Student Movement director, will assist Dr. Swain in the consecration service. Also participating in the service will be The Rev. Monk, Dr. Robert R. Shrode, chairman of the A&M Wesley foundation board of directors; and Dr. Glen Flinn, former state director.

Others to be present will be the ministers and representatives of the three local Methodist churches in Bryan and College Station, representatives of the Texas Methodist Student Movement Inter-Conference commission, and representatives of the local board of directors.

Open house will be from 3 until 5 p.m. following the consecration service. Assisting Mrs. Robert C. Monk, wife of the director, during the open house will be Mrs. Nolan R. Vance, Mrs. W. R. Swain, Mrs. Harry Rankin, Mrs. Robert R. Shrode, Mrs. Eugene Cragg and Mrs. R. L. Jackson.

There will be an organ furnished by the Gray Piano company of Bryan for the service. Miss Kathryn Smith will be the organist.

SPIRE in the SNOW

Next time you see a church standing in the snow, its spire raised to the winter sky, think how hard it was to attend Sunday services in your grandfather's day.
