Sullins Announce Birth of Their Son

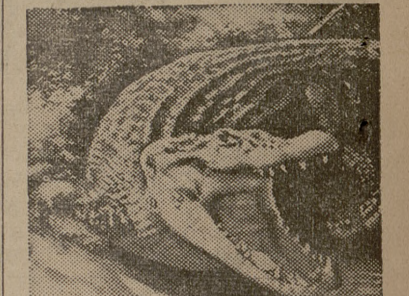
