\$110,000 City of College Station Revenue Bonds to be payable from and secured by a first lien on and pledge of the net revenues of the waterworks and sanitary sewer system of said City, to be issued for the purpose of securing funds with which to build and purchase improvements and extensions to the electric light system, and construct improvements and extensions to the waterworks system and the sewer system of said City. Said bonds are the third and final installment of \$200,000 of bonds voted January 8, 1951.
