

The City of College Station, Texas, will receive sealed bids at the City Hall, College Station, Texas, at 7:30 P. M., January 17, 1955 on the following revenue bonds of the City:

\$110,000 City of College Station Revenue Bonds to be payable from and secured by a first lien on and pledge of the net revenues of the waterworks and sanitary sewer system of said City, to be issued for the purpose of securing funds with which to build and purchase improvements and extensions to the electric light system, and construct improvements and extensions to the waterworks system and the sewer system of said City. Said bonds are the third and final installment of \$200,000 of bonds voted January 8, 1951.

\$265,000 City of College Station Revenue bonds to be payable from and secured by a pledge of the net revenues from the operation of the electric light and power system of said City, to be issued for the purpose of constructing improvements and extensions to the City's existing sanitary sewer system. Said bonds are the first installment of \$300,000 of bonds voted December 1, 1954.
