The Petroleum Engineering Wives club met Monday and saw the film "This is Oil" in the Memorial Student center. A brief business meeting was held before the movie.

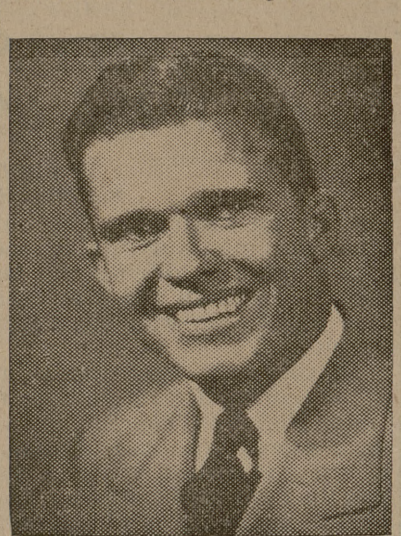
Officers Installed By Presbyterians

The Rev. Frank Bounds, a missionary who recently returned from Milan, Italy, will speak at the Baptist Student Union vespers Thursday and Friday at 7 p.m.

Bounds will counsel and talk with students about mission fields in Europe and give his impressions of evangelistic work in Great Britain.

In addition to Bounds' work in Italy, he has been in Europe attending Baptist pastors' conferences. In 1954 he was a member of the Billy Graham team conducting the London evangelistic crusade in Britain. He will relate some of his experiences during his messages at the vespers services.

The Rev. Bounds was graduated from Hardin-Simmons university in 1947 and South-Western Baptist Theological seminary in 1950. He was elected State Baptist Student Union president for 1946-47 while at Hardin-Simmons.

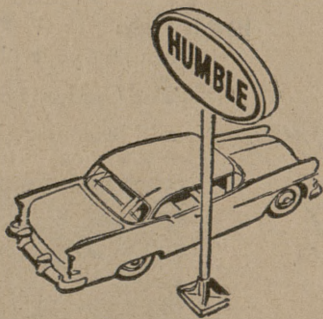
