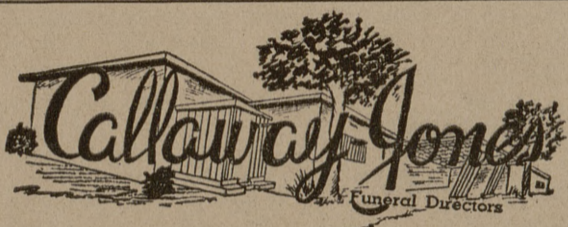

"I believe it will be a honey of a place," he said.

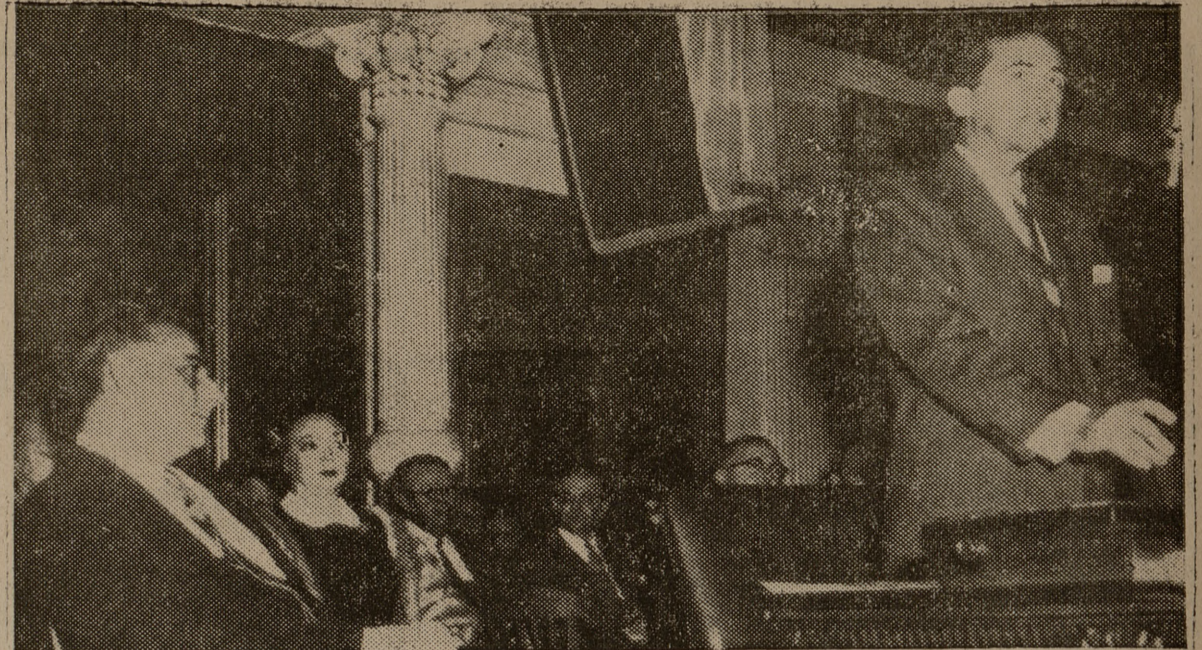

Panel walls, a new lighting system, lower acoustic ceilings, draperies, new tables and chairs and a new PA system will go before the February meeting of the board of directors for approval.

The same work will be done to Duncan dining hall after the Sbisa remodeling is finished. Work on Duncan is subject to board approval.

The Geology Wives club met this week in the library of the Geology building and made plans and policies for the programs for this year.

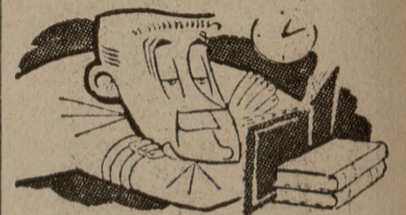
