### Nuclear Physics May Be Scheduled

A new non-technical course in nuclear physics may be offered for the spring semester, if sufficient interest is indicated by students, said C. H. Bernard of the physics department.  
The course, physics 310, is a three hour non-mathematical course dealing with the description and uses of atomic phenomena, and will include such topics as X-rays and natural and artificial radioactivity.  
Physics 310, Bernard said, is primarily for students of animal science, biology, genetics, biochemistry, pre-dentistry, pre-medicine, and veterinary medicine.  
All interested students should call the physics department before registration, Bernard said, and give a list of the most probable hours available to them for the course.
