

Layer Gives Talk On Russian Living

Dr. Robert G. Layer of the economics department was the guest speaker at the January meeting of the College Women's Social club last week in the Memorial Student Center.

Layer spoke on "Living Standards in Soviet Russia," and made comparisons between the living conditions of the various classes in Russia.

The idea of equality has been

abandoned, he said. Those at the top enjoy many advantages as compared to the poor living conditions of the peasants or farmers who compose the largest social group.

Between these extremes are the "New Bourgeoisie," similar to the United State's middle class in standards of living, and the workers in the cities who have poor living conditions, Layer said.

Layer said the housing conditions have improved, although by Western standards living conditions in Russia are very poor.
