

Aggies Begin Practice for Second Meeting With TCU

With an eye on curbing the scoring of TCU's Dick O'Neal, the Aggie basketball team continues its workouts tonight for the Feb. 2 clash with the Frogs in Ft. Worth. This is the second workout for the Cadets since the 71-58 loss to TCU last Saturday. Guard Roger Harvey returns to active list for the first time since twisting his knee in the LSU game. Harvey did not play in the TCU game. Coach John Floyd calls Harvey

the "best defensive player in the conference." The fast improvement of sophomore center George Mehaffey adds at least one bright spot to A&M's hopes in the conference race. Mehaffey has averaged 20 points in his last five games, and has hit 25 out of 48 field goals in the last three games. He is also the top defensive man on the squad, having tabbed 48 rebounds. "There's no doubt about it," said Floyd, "he's the most improv-

ed player on the team." Other players singled out by Floyd as having improved are Don Bilbrey, John Henry, Bill Brophy and John Fortenberry.

CHS Ties for Lead By Besting Bobcats

The A&M Consolidated Tigers battled their way to a first place tie in district 25-A by dropping the Cypress-Fairbanks Bobcats 48-41 Tuesday night. The win left the Tigers and Cypress-Fairbanks deadlocked in district standings with 4-1 records. CHS has a 11-6 season record, while Cypress-Fairbanks sports a 12-5 record. CHS has now won seven out of the last eight games it has played. In the B game, Cypress-Fairbanks eased past the Tigers 39-32. The Tiger B squad led at the start of the third quarter 20-18, but saw their lead whittled away in the final period. The Tigers came back from a 20-21 half-time deficit in the A game and tied the contest midway in the last quarter, 40-40. Consolidated then made eight straight

free throws in the final minutes to give them the 48-41 win. Consolidated's Norman Floeck took top scoring honors in the game with 16 points on seven field goals and two free throws. Jerry Oden and J. C. Carroll tied for second among CHS scorers with nine points each. Bobby Adams and Gerald Reifel led the Bobcats in scoring with 13 points each. Adams had been averaging about 25 points per game, but was limited to only three points in the second half due to some stout defensive work on the part of Jerry Oden. Bobby Potts was the top point maker in the B game for CHS with 12 points. CHS made 16 out of 47 field goal attempts in game for 34 per cent completion. The Tigers meet Tomball Friday night in their next district clash, at Tomball. Tomball upset Consolidated in the first district game, 32-29.

A&M Boxers To Compete In Tournament

Eighteen members of the A&M Boxing club will compete in the regional Golden Gloves tournament in Waco Jan. 27-31. The Aggies are rated top contenders for three team trophies.

Led by lightweight James Earle and heavyweight Jack Davis, the Cadets have nine entries in both the open and novice divisions.

Earle won the regional open lightweight title at Waco last year as the 1954 Aggies lost the open team championship by one point to Baylor. Davis, a freshman football player, was a state finalist last year in the Oklahoma Golden Gloves.

Earle has had 36 amateur fights, Davis 18. Flyweight Connie Eckard has had 44 fights, welterweight F. L. Dischler 32.

Entered in the open division are—flyweight, Kenneth Davis; featherweight, Eckard and Odus Loozier; lightweight, Earle; welterweight, Dischler and Jim Hebert; middleweight, Frank Roberts; light heavyweight, Jack Fowler; heavyweight, Davis.

In the novice division are—featherweight, Don Willis; lightweight, Jim Anz; welterweight, Don Garner, Phil Weibert and Ed Weeren; middleweight, Don Weaver and Bill Goode; light heavyweight, Tony Campos and Jim Vandermeer.

Earle, the club president, said members also will compete in the Southwest AAU meet set for March in Dallas.
