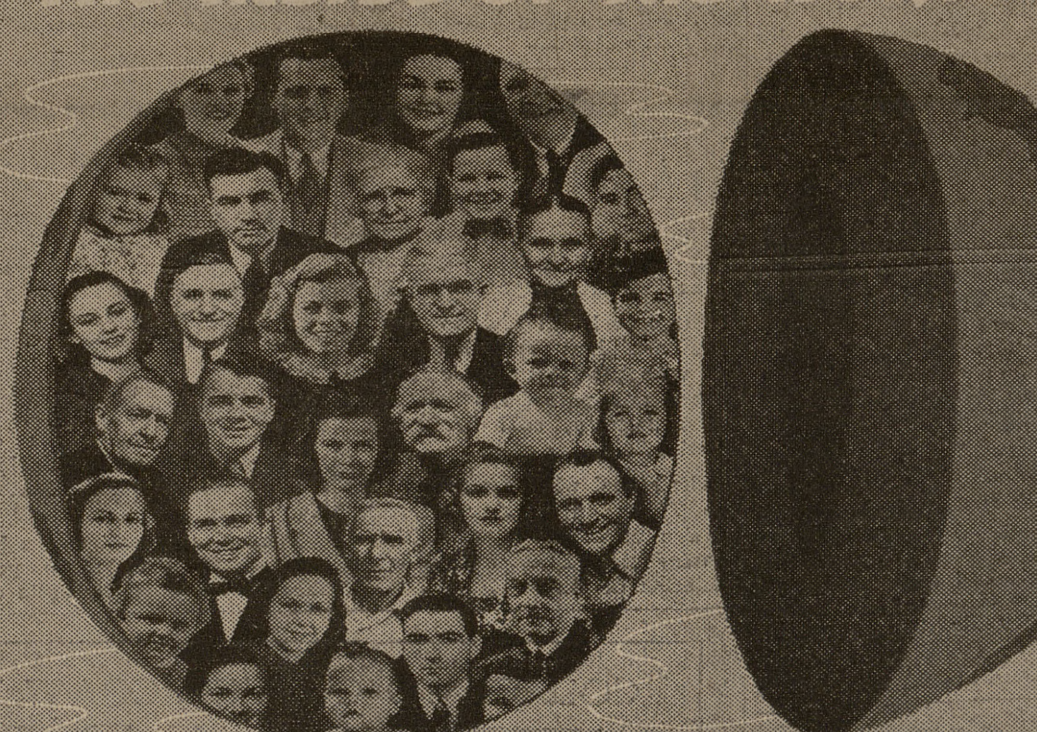

Remembering his four years of working in school—firing boilers, as a laborer on construction jobs and as a waiter in a Bryan supper club, and recalling the help extended to him in his senior year, Cheek's gift was sent to help some other senior needing and deserving aid at A&M.

The gift is to be placed under the name of Mr. and Mrs. Jones as a remembrance of help given a red-headed young man from Comanche, who now directs the training of the Thai police.
