'Cats, Texarkana **Named Favorites**

Lon Morris and Texarkana are favored to meet at 8:45 tonight in White coliseum in the finals of the Texas Junior College state basketball tournament but faced tough assignments in morning games.

The Bearcats met tough Howard County at 9 a.m. today and Texarkana played Allen academy at 10:45. The winners of those games play for the title. The losers meet at 7:15 tonight for third place.


