

Garden Center Holds Major Flower Show

The San Antonio Garden center, comprising 81 affiliated garden clubs, will sponsor its first major flower show, "Through Garden Portals," March 11-13, at the Bexar county coliseum in San Antonio.

Mrs. Porter Loring is president of the center and Mrs. C. B. Kilpatrick is general chairman. Joining in to help produce the floral show will be the Men's Garden club, the San Antonio Nurserymen's association and the Junior Garden clubs of the city as well as the two therapy clubs—Lone Star Garden club for the mentally ill and the Lamplight for the Blind.

There will be a junior division where children of garden club members and the junior garden clubs will have various types of entries. The educational and conservation divisions will have exhibits of trees especially adapted to this area that are drought resistant, and visual education on how to propagate a tree as well as shrubs suitable for food and cover for Texas songbirds. Another exhibit will be on how to have a wild-flower sanctuary in gardens.

STEELERS HAD KISS OF DEATH

PITTSBURGH—(AP)—The annual National Football league lottery for new players is proving to be the kiss of death for the Pittsburgh Steelers. Of 19 players named by the Steelers as their No. 1 draft choice, nine either failed to make the grade or refused to play pro football. None of the remaining 10 has proved to be an outstanding star.

Five Journals Use Hancock Articles

C. Kinney Hancock, chemistry professor and research chemist with the Texas Engineering Experiment station, had articles published in five national journals during 1954.

With G. M. Watson and R. F. Gilby, Hancock co-authored a report titled "Heats of Combustion of the Five-Carbon Fatty Acids and Their Methyl and Ethyl Esters" which appeared in the March issue of the Journal of Physical Chemistry.

In August the Journal of Chemical Education published his article, the Quantitative Analysis Notebook and in September a paper titled "Performance of Soils Versus Chemical Properties" was published by the American Society of Civil Engineers under the cover title Proceedings Separate No. 499.

Two journals carried Hancock articles in their November issues. A report on the "Determination of Water in Soils by an Indirect Conductivity Method" which C. M. Hudgins jr. co-authored appeared in Analytical Chemistry, and in Industrial and Engineering Chemistry an article reported on "Plasticized Sulfur Compositions for Traffic Marking."
