

This year, 5,100 students out of 5,200 paid the activity fee here. There is also a \$5 hospital fee required for all students living in college housing. This fee would probably be included in the overall activity fee under the new bill.

A&M Might Adopt Dr. M. T. Harrington, A&M Sysem chancellor, said yesterday that A&M would probably adopt a required fee if the Legislature approves the bill.

He said he did not know how much the required fee would be, because the board would have to study the present activity fee before making a new one.




