With Grant at quarterback, the Maroons got to the White 13 in the second quarter, but Gene Henderson's fourth down field goal attempt was no good from the 25.

Later in the period, the Maroons had chances at the 32 on a fumble recovery by end Gene Stallings and a drive to the 24.

In the third quarter, the Reds got to the White 25 and 26 and the "Bottle Babies" drove to the vets' 28.

The Whites had 14 first downs to 13 for the Maroons and had a 230 to 186 rushing edge. Both passed sporadically and mostly ineffectively but it was only the ninth workout of the spring. The Whites gained 27 yards on three completions of eight tries, the Maroons 27 yards on three of 11 attempts.
