# Resolution Passed For Friendship Day

A resolution proclaiming March 7 as Friendship day was passed by the fifty-fourth annual convention of the fourth district of the Texas Federation of Women's Clubs yesterday during the convention's second day of session.

The convention is being held in the Memorial Student Center and will close today following the final reports and awards. The resolution read "Whereas: Friendship Day, March 7th has been observed for many years throughout Texas with the purpose of promoting friendliness and understanding among individuals, organizations and nations, and whereas: We believe that designating one day each year to stress the importance of building friendship and goodwill is of great value in gaining world understanding, and whereas: The GFWC at the convention in Washington in 1953 made the observation of March 7th as Friendship Day a part of the program,

Therefore: Be it resolved that the Fourth District, in convention assembled, respectfully request the GFWC to set up a chairmanship so that the program may be carried throughout the federation, signed, Mrs. Willis Keeler, chairman of the Friendship Day committee of the TFWC."
