

According to this week's Sports Illustrated magazine, Florida offers a course in fishing, for college credit. The course, justly called one of the most popular at the University, is taught in the physical education department by a man who is now working on his doctor's degree in the science of angling.

According to Sports Illustrated, the course is no snap-it involves written and oral quizzes, and a lab that starts at 4 a.m. It is co-educational, though.

A&M, long a leader in the land-grant field, has missed the boat here. The sky is the limit on courses of this type.

When Dr. Robert Hutchins, former chancellor of the University of Chicago, spoke here last fall, he mentioned a course in "rest and relaxation" taught at a California college.

Here, we believe, is A&M's chance to breach could wreck the corps of cadets more underprivilized children. Advance tickets are 50 cents each and can catch up with the rest of the nation in Progressive Education. Although this California school has a head start, A&M, with the natural talent available, could become the world's foremost teacher of rest and relaxation.
