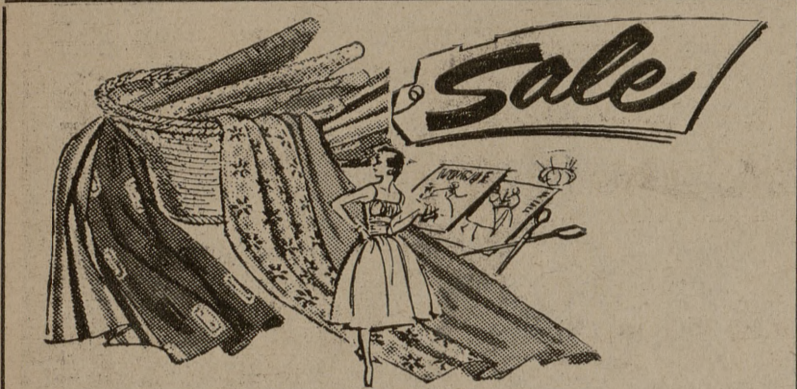

for man, so we must rely on our superior technology and production."
"It would be foolhardy to ignore their armed forces, industry, total resources, and nuclear weapons," he said.

Weyland said the United States is "not alone" in the world. "Most of our allies, the other free nations of the world, are individually weak but collectively strong," he said. "But the burden of providing industrial and military leadership falls on us."

At the start of his talk, Weyland said he was "happy and grateful to be home for this Muster."
"I've been to Muster ceremonies all over the world since I left here," he said, "and seeing them brought to me the full impact of the meaning of the tradition."

Before the Muster began, the Air Medal was presented posthumously to Audrey W. Frederick '51, who was killed in Korea while flying an unarmed liaison airplane.
