'Falling Short'

Civilian students at A&M have gone far this year in taking their place in the activities of the school.

The Civilian Student Council, in its first year, has acted on what it has thought beneficial for civilians and for the college.

But apathy on the part of the students would be an insurmountable barrier.

The civilian weekend starts Friday night with a barbecue. The council has gone out on a limb, feeling that the students wanted more activities and would support these activities.

Now, with just a few days left the council has been told, "I'm afraid we're falling short."

About a \$250 loss is coming up if the students don't support this barbecue. Only 600 tickets have been sold, and the council, because of an ordering deadline, has already made arrangements for 900 persons.

Unless civilian students show real interest in doing their part, they are in danger of losing not only this money, but an irretrievable amount of prestige.
