Christian Council Calls Student Aid

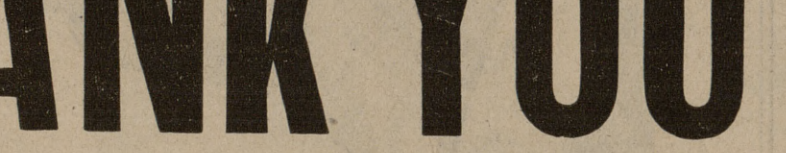
The United Student Christian council called representatives of its 15 co-operating student Christian movements and international students from many nations to review the services now being rendered in behalf of students from abroad.
