Boy Scout News

Sales Planned for Magazine

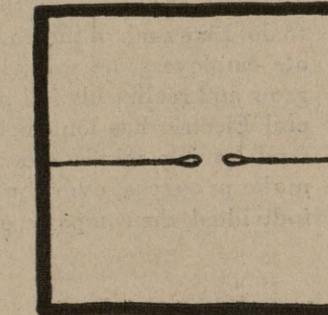
