#### Vanilla Refrigerator Cookies

Temp.: 375°F. Time: About 10 minutes Yield: About 5 dozen  
1½ cups sifted enriched all-purpose flour  
¾ cup granulated sugar  
¾ cup brown sugar, packed  
½ teaspoon baking soda  
1 egg  
2 to 3 teaspoons vanilla  
½ cup chopped nuts (optional)  
Sift together first 3 ingredients. Mix, until creamy shortening, sugar, egg, vanilla. Gradually add flour mixture, nuts; mix well. Turn dough onto large piece of waxed paper. Shape into roll. Chill several hours, overnight, or several weeks.  
To bake: Heat oven. Slice dough ¼" to ½" thick. (Slice off only what you need; return rest to refrigerator to bake as needed). Place on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake till golden brown.

#### Devil's Food Cake

Sift together into large bowl: 1½ cups sifted cake flour, 1 teaspoon salt, 1 teaspoon soda, ½ cup cocoa. Add rest of ingredients: 1½ cups sugar, ¾ cup milk, 2 eggs (unbeaten), ½ cup shortening (soft), 1 teaspoon vanilla. Mix at medium speed for one and one-half (1½) minutes, or if mixed by hand, count 100 strokes per minute. Bake at 350 degrees for 20 to 25 minutes, or until done.

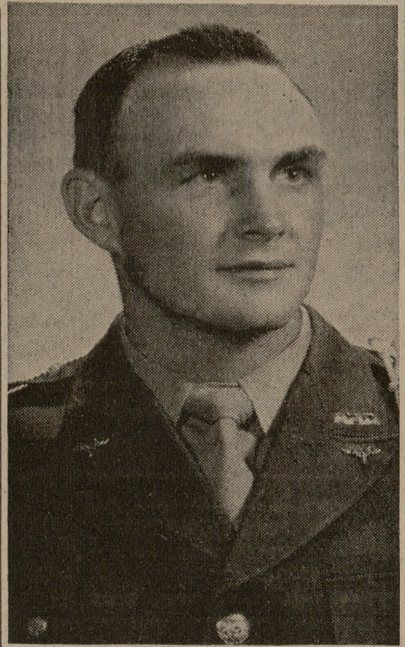
