

Former Dean Honored As Man of Month

Charles N. Shepardson, former dean of the School of Agriculture, has been designated by the East Texas Chamber of Commerce as its "Man of the Month" for July.

The story of Shepardson's career, which resulted in his becoming known to most Texans as "Mr. Agriculture," is featured in the July issue of East Texas Magazine, official publication of the regional chamber.

When informed of Shepardson's appointment to the Board of Governors for the Federal Reserve System, D. W. Williams, vice-chancellor for agriculture, said, "Having worked closely with Dean Charles Shepardson for some 27 years, I can say without reservation that he is a 'top hand' on any assignment he undertakes."

Williams added that Shepardson has a "rare combination of the academic and the practical, of the discipline required for first-class performance with the sympathy and knowledge of human shortcomings, of the give and take, of hard work and hard play. He is an obstinate taskmaster and an understanding employer."

Sweet and Sour Pork

1 lb. pork
1/4 cup soybean sauce
1/2 t. salt
1 cup flour
1 1/2 cups sugar

1 cup vinegar
1 carrot
4 onions
2 small peppers
1 t. chopped parsley

Slice the meat into small pieces, about one inch. Mix meat well in soybean sauce and salt. Stir flour in water to make a thin paste, and dip each piece of meat in the paste. Drop in pan with frying oil and cook until brownish.

Take sugar and vinegar and season to your taste with salt, pepper, and whatever other condiments you wish. Carrots, onions, pepper and parsley may be chopped or sliced fine and added to the sweet and sour solution.

Remove oil from pan and add sweet and sour solution and vegetables to the cooked meat. When all are thoroughly heated it is ready to serve. Makes enough for four.

Cheese Roll

2 packages cream cheese
1 package pimiento cheese
1 package Chateau
1 t. mixed dried herbs

1 package Old English cheese
2 packages Velveeta cheese
1 wedge Roquefort (optional)

Let warm to room temperature. Mix and season with 1/2 grated onion, grated bud garlic, celery salt, pepper and salt. Form roll with hands until all are thoroughly mixed and cover with paprika.

Date Cake

2 cups chopped dates
2 cups chopped nuts
2 cups hot water
2 t. soda

1/4 lb. butter
2 cups sugar
3 cups flour (sift before measuring)

Put hot water and soda over chopped dates and let stand while mixing butter and sugar. Add this mixture to dates, flour and nuts, and bake in moderate oven about 1 1/2 hours. Ice with any brown sugar icing.

Oil Company's Men Finish Pet E. Course

Employees of the Magnolia Petroleum Company's petroleum engineering department have just concluded a month's special course in advanced petroleum reservoir engineering, under the direction of Robert L. Whiting, head of the Petroleum Engineering Department at A&M.

Primary purpose of the course was to familiarize the men with the latest developments in petroleum reservoir engineering. Particular emphasis was placed on the evaluation and prediction of the future performance of reservoirs in which natural water drives were present and in reservoirs to be operated under pressure maintenance.

The men were housed in the Memorial Student Center, and classes were conducted there. The class schedule was from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. five days a week.

The ten men taking the course were selected by D. V. Carter, chief petroleum engineer, Magnolia Petroleum Co., from the district and division offices of Texas, Louisiana and Oklahoma. They are all graduate petroleum engineers having a minimum of four years field service.

Those taking the course included John L. Sanders, Otis Chalk, Texas; M. C. Gullede Jr., and K. D. Stidham, Midland; T. Griffith, Morgan City, La.; M. H. Beaver, Mamou, La.; Paul E. Erwin, Healdton, Okla.; C. T. Evans, Kermit; J. W. Tucker Jr., and Norman Bellingier, Falfurias; and Doyle G. Marrs of Vanderbilt.

Parker Returns To Ag Extension

Cecil A. Parker, on study leave from the Texas Agricultural Extension Service since September 1, 1954, has returned to the Service as agent in farm and home development. Director G. G. Gibson said Parker's headquarters will be at College Station.

Since last September Parker has been doing graduate work at North Carolina State College under an Oscar Johnston Cotton Foundation scholarship. He has completed all academic work for the master's degree in farm management. He also did work in program development and agricultural economics.

He served in the U. S. Navy from 1944 to 1946 and spent seven months in the Philippine Islands.
