Spaghetti Dish Time Saver

Chicken Spaghetti

This spaghetti dish is one of my favorite dishes to serve on a ball game day or when I am having a crowd, as it can be prepared the day before, placed in the refrigerator overnight, and baked just before serving time.

Simmer a large hen in water to cover, with two teaspoons salt, one bay leaf, one onion and several outside stalks of celery. When

tender, take meat off the bone and cut in good size pieces. Strain the broth.

Saute one onion chopped in two tablespoons of butter. When soft, add a can of mushroom soup and stir until smooth. Add one pint tomato juice, one pint chicken broth, ½ teaspoon garlic chopped fine, ½ teaspoon Worcestershire sauce, one small can chopped mushrooms and salt to taste.

Cook sauce for 10 or 15 minutes as slowly as possible to blend flavors. Add ½ cup stoned and chopped ripe olives.

Parboil for seven minutes one or two packages of spaghetti in salt water. Drain in colander. Grate ¾ lb. American cheese.

This should make two large casseroles. Combine in layers of spaghetti, chicken, broth and cheese until dishes are full. Sprinkle top with cheese and dot with whole ripe olives. Bake uncovered for about one hour at 350 degrees. When stored in refrigerator overnight, be sure to cover it tightly.



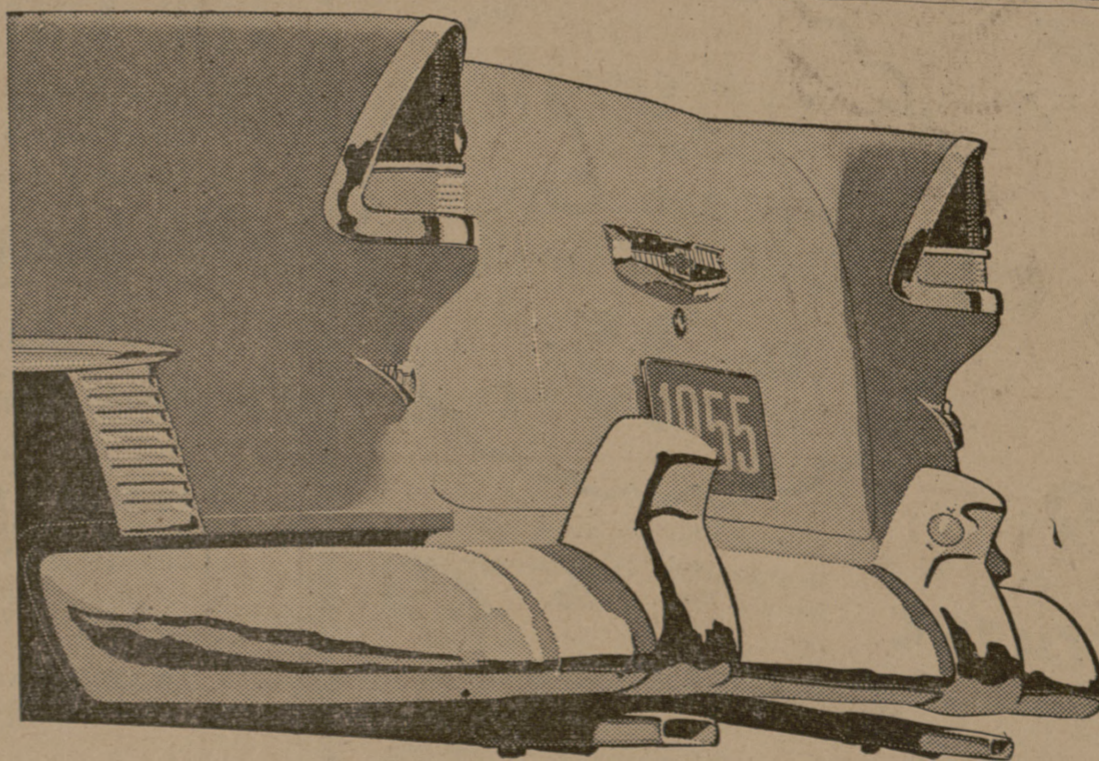
