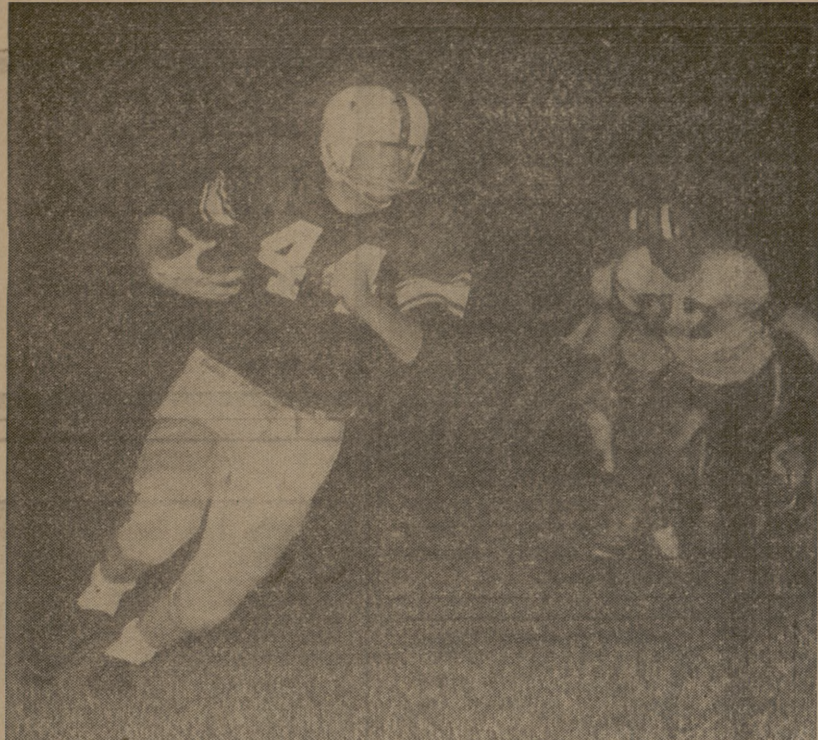


A&M's First, Second Teams Get Rest After Blasting LSU 28-0 at Dallas

A&M's first and second teams took things easy yesterday after running-up the widest Aggie victory margin since 1951 in last Saturday night's 28-0 conquest of LSU.

"I want to compliment everybody," said Coach Paul Bryant yesterday, after reviewing the LSU game film, "That line! They all played well."

The aroused Aggie forward wall, spear-headed by Lloyd Hale, Jack Powell, Charles Krueger, Dee Powell, Murry Trimble, Jim Stanley and Dennis Goehring kept the vaunted LSU backfield on its back most of the night. The Bayou Bengals netted only 18 yards on the ground in the first half.

As for LSU's heralded passing attack—it never materialized. One

LSU fan pretty well summed-up the Aggie's tough pass defense. "Even a low flying plane would have had trouble over the Cotton Bowl Saturday night."

"Everybody tried hard. You could tell that," Bryant said. "But, we made a lot of mistakes. We were reckless. We won't be able to make those mistakes later on, and win."

John Crow, pile-driving 195-pound halfback, and Jack Pardee, a fullback who is as playful as a Sherman tank, led the Cadet scoring parade with two touchdowns each.

Crow was the game's leading ground gainer with 130 yards in 13 carries, an average of 10 yards per try. Pardee was next with 91 yards in eight tries. Little Loyd Taylor had 57 yards in seven cracks at the line.

"The boys who did most of the playing" suited out in sweat suits yesterday and ran through offensive plays.

Tigers Schedule Hard Workouts

A&M's Consolidated Tigers, in bowing to Navasota's Rattlers, 27-13, showed a definite need for hard work this week in preparation for the Smiley Eagle's invasion Friday night.

The Rattlers completely dominated Friday night's contest, taking advantage of several breaks to send the Tigers to their second defeat in three starts.

Picking up 16 first downs to eight for the Tigers, Navasota

gained 318 yards, all on the ground. CHS managed but 44 yards rushing and completed four of ten passes for 55 yards.

Rattler quarterback Jerry Rogers swept right end for 38 yards to climax a nine-play 78 yard drive following the opening kickoff. Fred Lohmeyer converted.

Minutes later Rattler Paul Matney broke through to block a Tiger punt on the 22 and in seven plays Navasota led, 14-0.

The Tigers scored late in the second quarter after a bad pass from center gave them possession on the Navasota eight. Fullback Bill Kavanaugh blasted over from the one and Norman Floeck converted.

The Rattlers scored in both the third and fourth quarters to take a commanding 27-7 lead. Edgar Feldman ran over the Tiger's second tally with 1:30 remaining after a fumble recovery on the Navasota 26.

Third Baseman Ransom Jackson of the Chicago Cubs never played baseball until he tried out for the team at Texas University. That first year he hit .500.



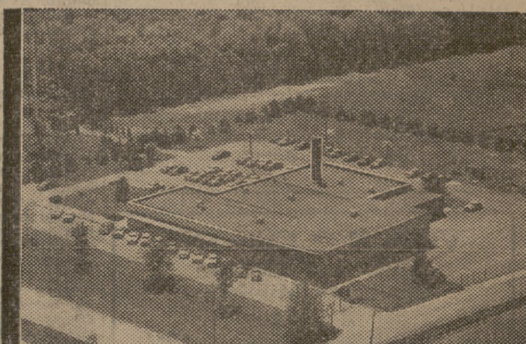

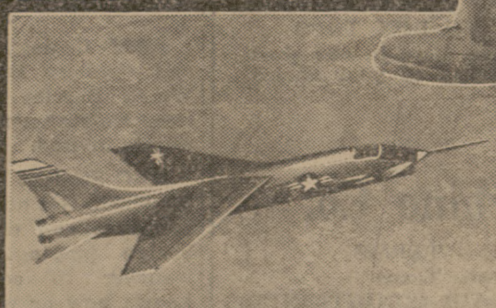
