UNION FEE ELECTION
Pursuant to the provisions of Senate Bill No. 305, Regular Session, 54th Legislature, State of Texas, notice is hereby given of a student election to be held in the Memorial Student Center on the campus of the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Texas, College Station, Texas, during two days of the week beginning September 26, 1955, these days being Wednesday and Thursday, September 28 and 29, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Central Standard Time, each day, for the purpose of voting for or against the levying of a student fee of Two Dollars (\$2.00) per student for each semester of the long session and One Dollar (\$1.00) per student for each term of the summer session for the sole purpose of operating, maintaining, and improving the Memorial Student Center at the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Texas.

Notice of this election shall be published in the student newspaper, "The Battalion," for three consecutive days during the week of September 19, 1955, in substantially the same form as this resolution of the Board of Directors. The President of the College was authorized to select the exact dates of the election and publication of notice. The Board of Directors of the Agricultural and Mechanical College of Texas shall canvass the returns and declare the results of said election and if a majority of students voting in said election shall vote in favor of such fee, then the Board may levy the fee in an amount not in excess of the amount authorized at said election.
