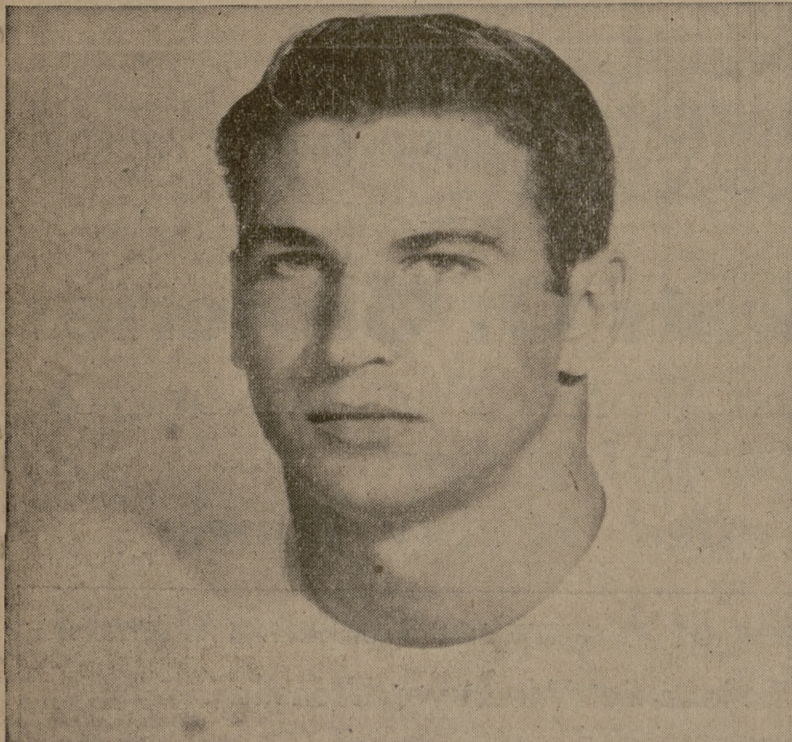


Varsity Sharpens Attack for Nebraska; Fish Battle TCU Wogs Tonight at 7:30

A&M's Varsity sharpened its offensive weapons yesterday afternoon in a short, but boisterous, scrimmage while the Aggie Fish took things easy.

The Fish open their five game schedule tonight at 7:30 p.m. on Kyle Field against the tough TCU Wogs. Admission is free to student activity card holders.

With ailing quarterback Bobby Conrad determined to play Saturday against Nebraska's fired-up Cornhuskers, the Aggies will be almost at full strength again.

Conrad Recovering

"Conrad's still favoring his leg, or so it looks to me," said Coach Paul Bryant, "but he says he's gonna' play Saturday. We'll see."

When Coach Bryant asked Conrad why he was favoring his leg, injured in practice before the LSU game, Bobby replied, "Aw, it's just a habit I have. I could feel something once or twice the other day, but it's alright now."

Still on the injured list are tackle Henry Clark, a starter against UCLA, and ends Roger Hobson and Dean Meeke. Fullback Cliff Hamby, who had seven stitches taken in his face after being cleated in the University of Houston game, will definitely be able to play against Nebraska.

A&M's well-conditioned squad has had no serious injuries in any of its game so far this season. In fact, none of the trainers have had to make a trip onto the playing field to see about a player. All this has given "Smokey" Harper, A&M's renowned trainer, something to worry about.

"Looks like I'm gonna' be out of a job 'fore the season's over," drawled Harper.

Donnie Grant and Conrad alternated at the man-under positions on the No. 1 and 2 varsity units yesterday, while Jimmy Wright and Don Watson took charge of the third team.

Teaming with Grant and Conrad on the first team were halfbacks John Crow and Loyd Taylor, and fullback Jack Pardee. George Gillard alternated with Pardee at fullback.

First Team Line

Ends Gene Stallings and Bobby Drake Keith, tackles Jack Powell and Charles Krueger, guards Dee Powell and Jim Stanley and center Lloyd Hale made up the first team's line.

Keith was named Lineman of the Week by the Dallas Morning News for his spectacular play against Houston last weekend. He caught two touchdown passes and set up another by blocking a punt.

"He did everything except take up tickets," remarked Coach Bry-

ant, emphasizing Keith's great performance.

The Aggie freshmen run up against a big, fast line when they tackle the Texas Christian Polywogs tonight. TCU's line weighs in at a 215-pounds average per man. The Fish's probable starting line averages 198-pounds per player.

Fish Starters

Probable starters for the Aggie Fish tonight include Don Usry and John Tracey at ends; Leo Wotipka and J. E. Driskell, tackles; Carl Luna and A. A. Crews, guards and Richard Goff at center.

In the backfield for the Fish, Luther Hall gets the call at quar-

terback. Paul Delfeld and Joe Pascuzzi man the halfback posts, and Barney Smith starts at fullback.

"We haven't had much time to

work on offense," said Coach Elmer Smith, who has been working with the freshmen. "Most of our work has been centered around fundamentals."
