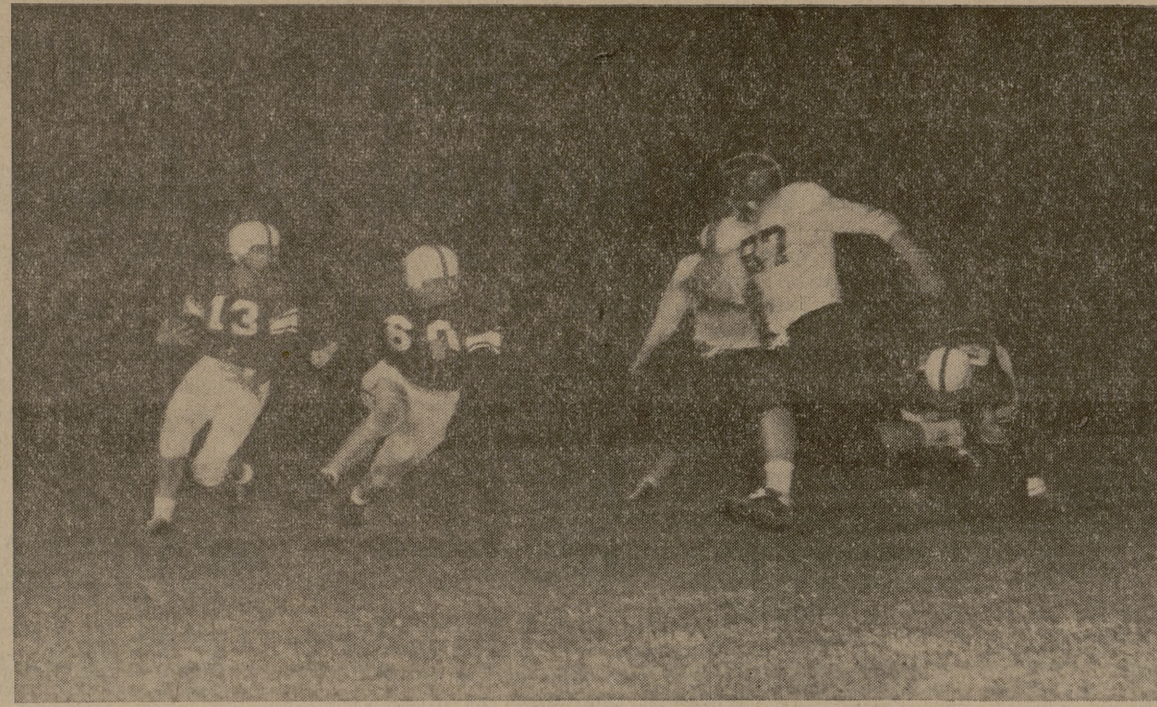

'56 Aggeland Picture Schedule

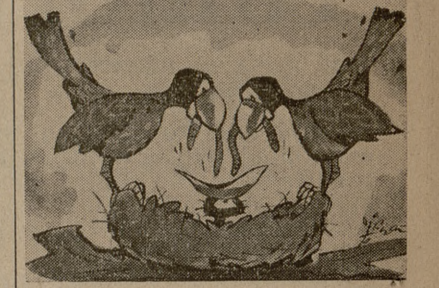

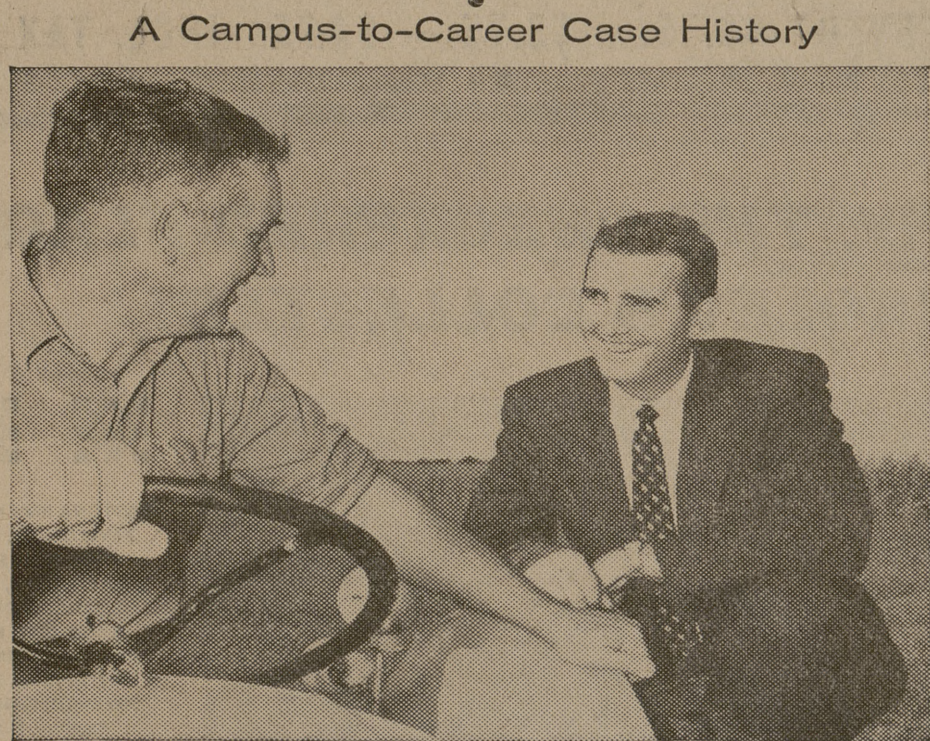
