# CHS Opens District Chase Against Katy Tonight at 8

A&M Consolidated's Tigers, with a 1-4-1 season record, open their District 25-A schedule in Katy tonight at 8 p.m.

The Tigers broke a three-game losing streak last Friday, holding the Cypress-Fairbanks Bobcats to a 6-6 tie.

Workhorse of the Tigers has been sophomore fullback Bill Kavanaugh, heaviest man on the starting lineup at 165 pounds, who leads in rushing with 301 yards in 96 carries. Behind him are Bobby

Witcher with 107 yards on 34 tries and Alton Arnold, who leads in scoring with 13 points and in the yards-per-try department with a 4.3 yard average on his 21 carries for 90 yards.

Quarterback Ed Feldman is second in scoring with 12 points and has 28 pass completions in 78 attempts for a 35.9 percentage.

Starters for Consolidated tonight include left end Norm Flock, left tackle Dick Hickman, left guard Garland Andrews, center Steadman Davis, right guard Jack McNeely, right tackle Ed Linton and right end Manuel Garcia in the forward wall.

Freshmen quarterback Feldman directs the Tiger's T-formation with Wayne Thompson and Arnold at the halfback positions and Kavanaugh at fullback.

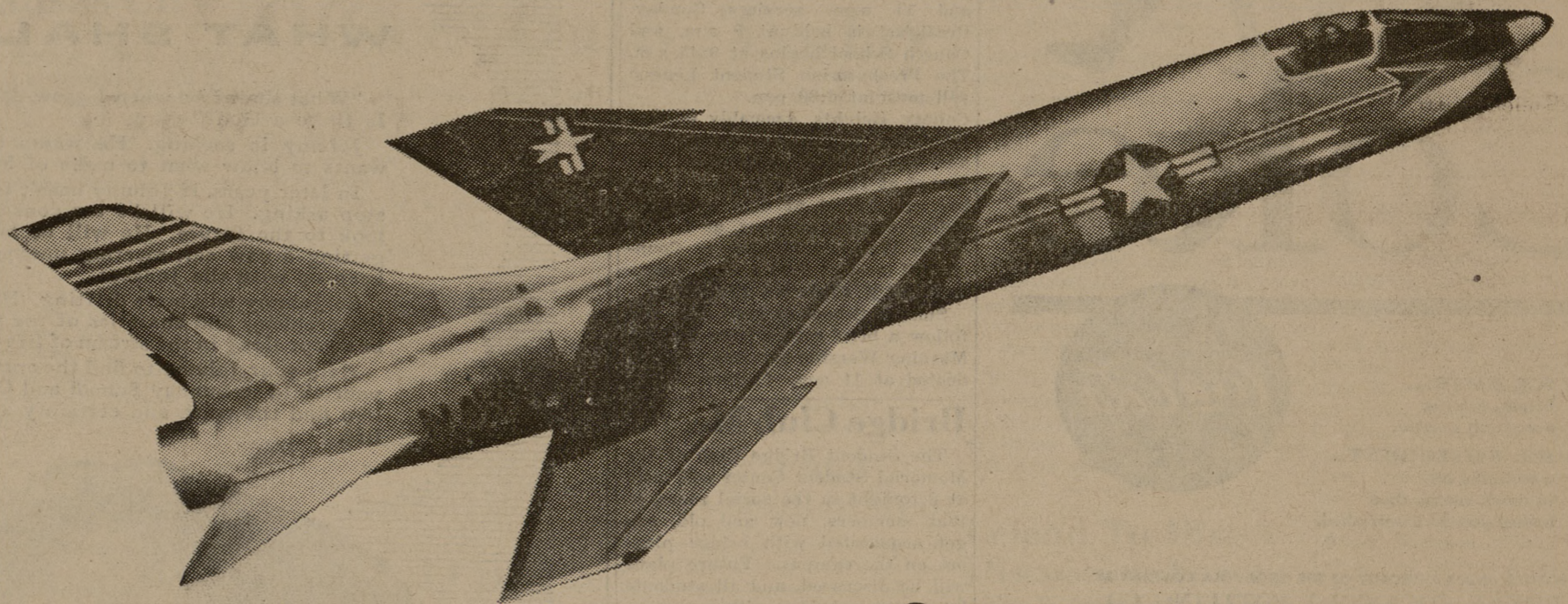

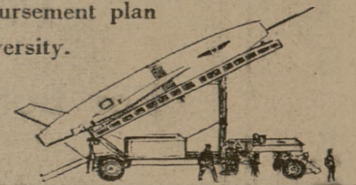
