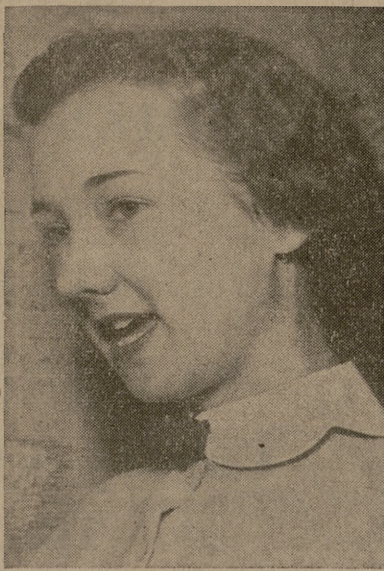


# 12 Baylor Leaders Speak at BSU Tonight
