

# Fiery Ags Butcher Baylor Bears 19-7

That good ol' Baylor line W A S N ' T last Saturday, as ruthlessly efficient A&M reduced the once arrogant Waco Bear to a state of stumbling bewilderment.

"Just tell the folks we got ate up," said Steve Owen, Baylor's line coach, and one time head coach of the pro-New York Giants.

A&M took over 11th place in the nation on the Associated Press' poll this week, barely being nudged out of the 10th spot

by Southern California.

Baylor's defeat was total. Even mighty Maryland, the nation's No. 1 team, failed to humiliate the Bruins so thoroughly, and so conclusively. Behind bone-splintering blocking, Aggie backs filtered through Baylor's tightly-drawn defenses for 264 yards. A&M controlled the ball, as well as the game, running 76 plays from scrimmage, and allowing the helpless Bears to handle only 40.

"We could tell when the Aggies came out for the kick-off that they were ready for it. We've just never been hit any harder by anybody," said Dugan Pearce, Baylor guard.

**Katy Nudges Tigers 13-6**  
**In Game's Final Minutes**

A&M Consolidated's Tigers, after being downed by Katy, 13-6, on a 60-yard return of a pass interception in the last two minutes, are engaged in some stiff workouts this week in preparation for Waller's invasion of Tiger Field Friday night.

Waller battled Tomball's Cougars to a 0-0 standstill last week in their second district conflict of the season, with the Bulldogs leading in penetrations, 2-1. Tomball had previously blanked Katy, 12-0.

Based on these results, which don't mean too much in Texas high school football, Waller will be favored to turn back the Tigers, but the local crew should be ready for a top-notch effort, as this will be their homecoming game.

A Frank Merriwell-type play by Dale Faulk of the Katy Tigers was responsible for beating Consolidated and thereby dropping them into the District 25-A cellar.

With 2:21 left to play, Faulk intercepted a pass on his own 40 and raced the remaining distance to pay dirt unmolested. George Miller booted the point after touchdown to give the hosts a lead that was "as good as gold" at that stage in the game.

Katy out-rushed Consolidated, 191-95, but the Tigers held the passing edge with 80 yards to their opponents' 29.
