Unbeaten Fish, Houston Kittens Tangle Here Tomorrow Night

Undeclared, and currently leading the Southwest Conference freshmen race, A&M's powerful Fish meet their only non-conference foe, the University of Houston Kittens, tomorrow night on Kyle Field.

Game time is 7:30. With victories over TCU, 27-6, and Baylor, 7-6, the Fish will be out to push ahead in their series with Houston. In 1952 the Kittens took a 26-21 decision and A&M plowed to a muddy 31-6 win last year. The teams didn't play in 1953.

LED BY THE terrific all-around play of halfback Joe Pascuzzi and a hard-nosed, fast-charging line,

the Aggie first-year men pounded the Wogs, and manhandled the supposedly-unbeatable Cubs.

Pascuzzi, stout 185-pound speedster, currently leads the Fish in rushing, pass receiving and scoring. He has gained 129 yards in 16 carries for one touchdown, and has caught two passes for 26 yards and another score. Four out of five perfect extra point kicks gives him 16 points so far this season. Joe is also second in punting with a 35-yard average on four boots.

IN TYPICAL Bear Bryant style, the Fish forward wall is well equipped with speed, desire and

enough meanness to handle any situation. Four of the muscle men can add all-state honors to their names, while two others wear watches of the north-south Texas High School All-Star game.

Left end Don Usry was one of the most sought after schoolboy stars in the nation and was selected on the all-state, all-Southern and all-American teams while playing at Cleburne. Nederland's A. A. Crews made all-state in Louisiana as a high school sophomore and again in Texas as a senior tackle. Tommy Howard, 206-pound guard, brings all-state recognition from

Ball High of Galveston and his running mate Carl Luna received the same honor while at Garland.

PHILLIPS' BIG end Don Smith, 6-2, 195, played for the north all-stars as did right tackle J. E. Driskell, of Lufkin.

Tremendous John Tracey, the squad's second biggest man at 6-3 and 216 pounds, was switched from end to fullback before the Baylor game and turned in an inspiring performance with 62 yards in 15 carries.

Houston's Kittens lost their only game to Delmar Junior College by a 39-6 score.

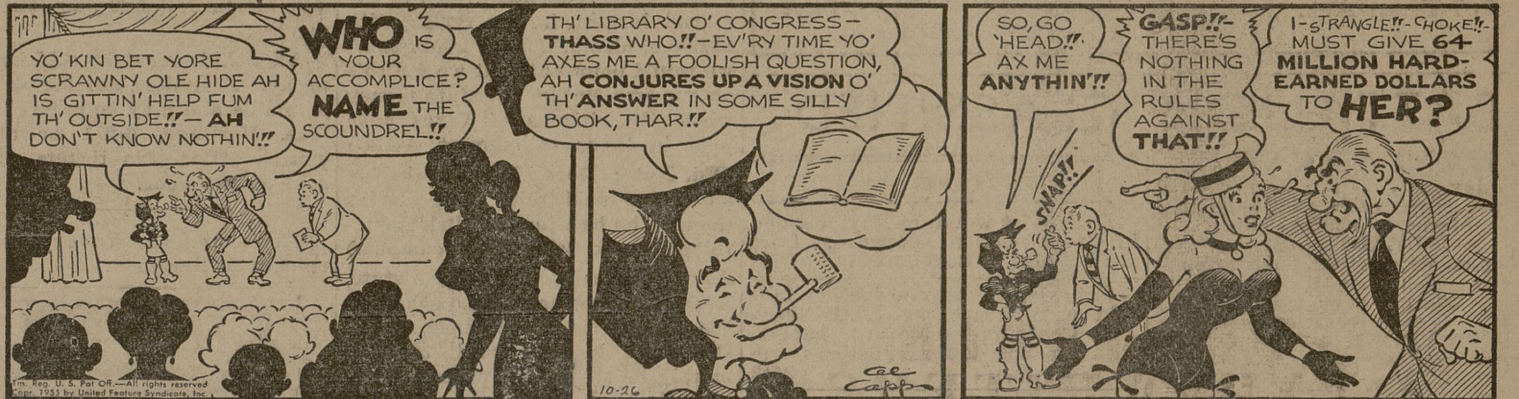
GOULD'S extra-point try was no good, but Roy Truesdale scored another safety for the airmen a few minutes later, and Squadron 16 led 10-0.
