

# Ag Fish Battle Houston Here Tonight at 7:30

A&M's unbeaten Fish, handicapped by the loss of 11 injured gridgers, battle the University of Houston Kittens in their last home appearance tonight at 7:30 on Kyle Field.

Admission is \$1 for adults and 50 cents for children. Student activity card holders will be admitted free.

With the young series tied at one win apiece, the first-year Aggies try to forge ahead against one of the finest freshmen teams in the

history of the Houston school. Houston won in 1952, 26-21, and the Fish slaughtered the Kittens last year, 31-6, on rain-swept Kyle Field.

The Aggies will be without the services of starting center Dick Goff, second string quarterback Hal Sandefur and their number two left halfback, Paul Delfeld.

Goff has started both Fish games and played a major defensive role in the Baylor game, intercepting a pass and returning it 13 yards to the Cub nine in the second period. Sandefur was one of Texas' finest

high school quarterbacks, and is a fine operator on the all-important optional play.

Delfeld leads the Aggies in the yard-per-carry department with 56 yards on but six carries for a 9.3 average.

Houston's biggest threat is left halfback Don Brown, younger brother of Aggie tackle Darrell Brown, who was the leading ground gainer in the Kittens' only game to date, a 39-6 loss to Delmar Junior College. Brown picked up 39 yards on seven carries.

A&M, currently leading the Southwest Conference freshmen division after a 27-6 victory over TCU and a 7-6 win over Baylor, will counter with a tremendous running game that features the all-the-way threat of halfbacks Joe Pascuzzi and Luther Hall and the bruising power of huge John Tracey at fullback.

Pascuzzi leads the Fish in rushing with 129 yards, in pass receiving with two catches for 26 yards, and in scoring with two touchdowns and four extra points for 16 total points.

Hall is second in ball carrying on the basis of 70 yards in 17 runs and leads in the passing department with three completions in four attempts for 42 yards and one score.

Converted to fullback from end after the Wog game, the 6-3, 216-pound Tracey displayed brute power against Baylor, rumbling for 62 yards in 15 trips.

**A TC Dumps Squadron 6 In Football**

Foy Royder returned Squadron 6's opening kickoff for a touchdown yesterday to spark A Transportation's 12-6 win in freshmen football.

Sqd. 6's Norman Neely stood out on defense but the airmen couldn't stop the TC onslaught after Royder's initial play.

Tom Brown sparked the air force aerial assault, and connected with Doyle Malone, who scampered 90 yards for their only TD.

It was a Sqd. 6 pass which set up A Transportation's winning score. In the second half James Kromer intercepted a toss and set the TC's up on their opponent's 10-yard line, where Ed Weuste tossed to Royder for a 12-6 lead which stuck.

Troy Tatum and Gary Poindexter were the boulders in the A-TC defense which clamped down early on Sqd. 6's ground yardage.

A Ordnance defeated Sqd. 17, 12-6 in another football game while B-Eng. nosed Sqd. 5, 20-19; Sqd. 9 blanked B-FA 14-0. Sqd. 9 outplayed A-FA, 9-7.
