## Aggie Harriers Meet Porkers At Arkansas

A&M's defending Southwest Conference champion cross country team, unbeaten in two starts so far this season, travels to Fayetteville to battle the Arkansas Razorbacks in a dual meet Saturday.

"If we win Saturday I think we'll win the conference championship," said head track coach Frank Anderson. "We'll take the boys up Friday, run at 10:30 Saturday morning and stay for the football game," he added.

Led by Bill Cocks, the Aggies have easily won both their meets this year. Cocks took first in the opening meet as the A&M harriers downed the University of Oklahoma and the University of Texas, 28-44-48. Two weeks ago they defeated Texas in a dual meet in Austin.

Cocks, Carl Wilmsen, Bob Boles, Ed Blake, Fidell Rul and Don Carver will make the trip to Arkansas. Blake, a squadman last year, was injured and didn't run in the opening meet. Cocks, Wilmsen and Boles are returning lettermen while Rul is a squadman and Carver holds a freshmen letter.
