¹ ⁴ cups chopped priced dates	2 cups brown sugar
cup granulated sugar	3 eggs, well beaten
cup water	4 cups sifted, all-purpose flou
cup chopped nutmeats	1/2 t. salt
cup shortening	½ t. baking soda

Combine dates, granulated sugar and water and cook over low heat until thick-about ten minutes. Add nut meats and cool for the date filling. Cream shortening and add brown sugar gradually. Add beaten eggs and beat mixture well. Add remaining ingredients (sifted to-gether) and mix well. Chill thoroughly. Divide dough into two parts and roll out separately into rectangles a little less than 1/4 inch thick. Spread each with date filling and form into two long rolls. Chill thoroughly; cut with sharp knife into 1/4 inch slices. Bake at 400 derees for 10 - 12 minutes


