A&M Freshman Shaven, Painted Saturday At UT

Durwood L. Brown, freshman aeronautical engineering major from Dallas, was shaved and painted by University of Texas students following the Fish-Shorthorn football game in Austin Saturday.

Brown said he went to Moore-Hill Hall by himself to change clothes and visit with some home town buddies. While there, he heard some Aggies yelling and went out the door of the dormitory to see if he could help.

As he left the dormitory, five UT students attacked him and tore his shirt off. He was blindfolded and taken to another dormitory where he was shaved below the waist and scratched about the face. He was then taken to another room or house and "hit on the back with a belt."

"The room was dark so I couldn't see who they were or get any description of them," Brown said.

He was taken back to Moore Hall in a black 1950 model Ford. His friends put medicine on his back and he then hitched a ride back to A&M with some seniors.

BOMBAY, India—More than 200,000 rioters led by Communists and Socialists of the extreme left turned this big industrial port into a smoking battlefield yesterday. Ten persons were reported killed and 250 wounded and 1,000 were under arrest when uneasy quiet was restored. Police and army units stood on the alert last night.

UNITED NATIONS, N. Y.—The U. N. Assembly yesterday voted 43-6 for a general conference to review the 10-year-old U.N. Charter at an "appropriate time."

BAGHDAD, Iraq—Britain and four other members of the Baghdad Pact took the first steps yesterday to set up a permanent defense organization along the Soviet Union's southern border. The Premiers of Iraq, Iran, Pakistan and Turkey met with British Foreign Secretary Harold Macmillan for the inaugural council meeting of the newly-formed alliance.
