

Varsity, Fish To Host Dial VI6-6415 For Classified Ads

Baylor Cagers Tonight

A&M jumps into the Southwest Conference cage race tonight as it plays host to Baylor's frisky Bears in White Coliseum at 8 p.m.
The Aggie Fish take on Baylor's Cubs in the night's opener at 6:30 p.m. KORA's Mike Mistovich will broadcast a play-by-play description of the game.
Currently resting in the fifth spot among SWC teams in season standings, the Aggies come into tonight's battle with a record of two wins and seven losses. Baylor has a 3-8 season mark, and stands fourth among conference teams.
The Cadet's starting quint will be made up of Bill Brophy, 6-3,

Fritzie Connally, 6-3, Roger Harvey, 5-11, Ken Hutto, 6-0, and George Mehaffey, 6-4.
Hutto broke into the starting lineup during the pre-season tournament at Houston last weekend and led Aggie marksmen with a total of 51 points in three games—an average of 17 points per game. He's a sophomore from Amarillo.
"Hutto is playing good ball," remarked Coach Ken Loeffler, "and I'm very pleased with his progress so far."
A&M's finish in the Houston tourney was disappointing, but only emphasizes what Loeffler said before the season started that "we can't win without the big guy."

The Bears, who have a 6-6 starting center in Louis Estes at the post position and a 6-5 forward in Jerry Mallett, an all-Southwest Conference selection last season, will have a definite height advantage over the Aggies.
Rounding out the Baylor starting five are senior Dennis Raines, 6-4, Albert White, 6-1 and Capt. Wayne Connally, 5-11.
Baylor has scored 642 points so far this season compared to 701 for opponents. A&M has chalked up 584 points to opponents' 671.
Hoping to extend their one-game winning streak and push past a .500 percentage on the season, the talented Aggie Fish match baskets with the Baylor Cubs in the opener of the first-year conference race tonight at 6:30 in White Coliseum.
The Fish broke even in their first two games thus far, being edged by Allen Academy, 75-72, and coming from behind in the last two minutes to down the University of

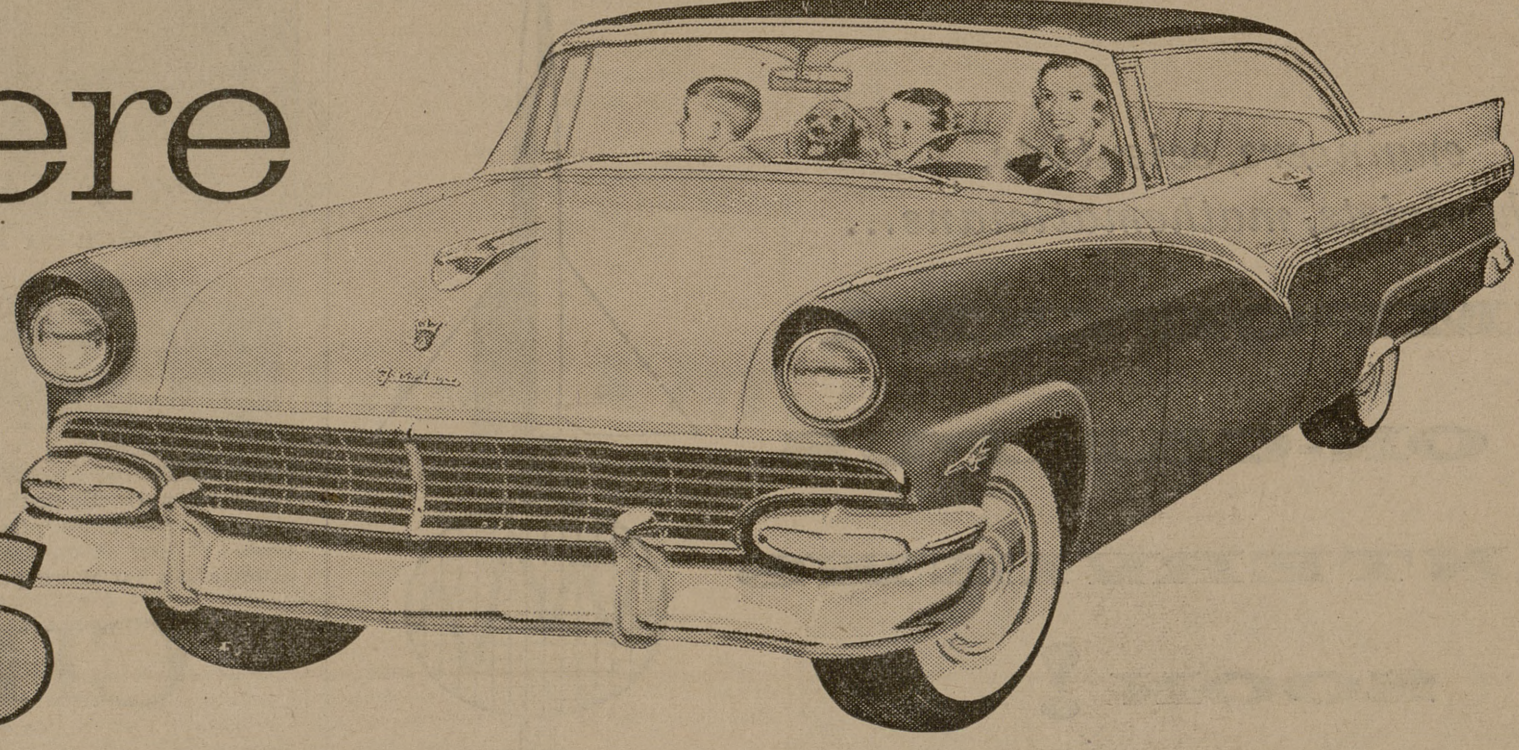
