Extremely Disappointed

Yesterday's punishment given 12 students for swinging a broom was well commented upon by the commandant: am extremely disappointed that these men would do such a thing to the Corps of Cadets.'

It is a mark against the entire Corps brought by a small group of men who let themselves be carried away by the spirit of the recent holidays. The Corps' primary function is to provide leaders-and for a man to be a leader he must be aware of far more than just the immediate. He must look to the far-reaching effects of every action he takes.

This breaking of the rules, another matter of concern to leaders, shows none of the former idea of a punishment; it was apparently done in a more jocular mood. But it still was just as wrong. And the wrongness exists both in the breaking of the rules and in the indignity, both to those who swung and those who received, of such a barbaric custom as using a board on grown men.

Cry out that it used to be a "tradition," that "Old Army's gone to hell," that "it's the only way to keep freshmen and sophomores in line"-any excuse one wishes to use. It's just no good; the board, and the broom, are ruled out. And at a school that is evolving with the modern world, it's ruled out for good.

Some may not like it this way, but the obligation is there. It takes a real leader to fully assume his responsibilities.


