**A&M Nine Plays 'Kats Today, UH Tomorrow**

Dick Munday serves up his right-handed slants to the Sam Houston State Bearkats today at 2:30 p.m. as Coach Beau Bell's Aggies open their 1956 baseball season at Huntsville.

Munday, whose brilliant 1.1 earned average was the highest on the Cadet team last year, is scheduled to pitch the first six innings. Doug Mullins, junior right-hander, will relieve Munday for the last three frames.

Wendell Baker, fast-balling junior righthander, toes the mound against the University of Houston

Cougars Saturday afternoon at 3 on Kyle Field. Lynn Monical, Toby Newton, Elo Zatopek and Ira Oertling will be available for relief.

First baseman John Hoyle, second sacker Dick Bleckner, third baseman Joe Worden and team captain Joe Boring, shortstop, make-up Coach Bell's starting infield.

Heading the list of starting outfielders is all-conference center-fielder John Stockton. Behn Hubbard and Phil Newport round out the outfield. Stockton and Hubbard are both lettermen, while Newport is a junior college transfer from Florida.

Behind the plate will be sophomore James Smotherman, a converted outfielder. Backing him up will be two juniors, Louie Nelson and Bob Gattis. Jimmy Williams,

who caught every inning of every game over the past two seasons, has graduated along with battery mates Joe Hardgrove and Jerry Nelson.

The Aggies are out to retain the Southwest Conference championship they won last year with a fine 13-2 record, and are regarded as one of the top three contenders this season along with Texas and TCU.

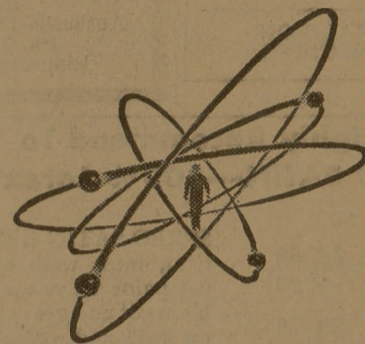
Last year's season opener against Sam Houston saw the Kats wind-up on the long end of a 9-3 score, but the Cadets came back in their second meeting to win, 3-1.

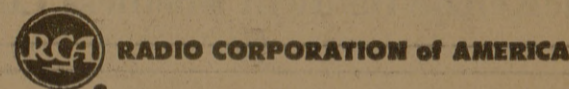

**Five A&M Sports Move Into Action**

Spring sports sweep on to the A&M scene like a blustery March wind Saturday with four Aggie athletic teams answering the call to action. Track, tennis and golf make their initial appearance of the new year and baseball opens its home season.

Golf starts the athletic extravaganza at 1 p.m. as the Aggies play host to the Lamar Tech Cardinals of Beaumont on the A&M golf course.

The Universities of Texas and Houston move into Kyle Field at 1:30 to challenge A&M's field-heavy tracksters in the first triangular meet of the season. The Aggies retained 70 per cent of their SWC runner-up team of 1955.

A&M's tennis team greets the 1956 season against the Houston Cougars at 2 p.m. on the clay courts west of the MSC. The Aggie net men finished fourth behind Texas, SMU and Rice last year.

Baseball returns to the scene of its 1955 glory at 3 p.m. as A&M's SWC champs match base hits with the Cougars. Wendell Baker gets the call to the mound tomorrow.

Aggie football fans will get a preview of the 1956 A&M team at 7:30 on Kyle Field when the Cadets square off in the annual Maroon-White intrasquad game. With 24 returning lettermen back from

the team that captured second place honors in the SWC, the Aggies are the strongest they have been in years.
