FRUIT COBBLER

1 large can peaches 1 T. corn starch

Butter Nutmeg 1 cup sugar

1/2 cup boiling water

Drain juice from peaches (or apricots) and add water to make two cups. Mix water, juice and cornstarch. Add 34 cup of sugar in the Assembly Room of the MSC. and chopped fruit. Dot generously with butter and sprinkle with nutmeg. Top with latticed hot water pastry (recipe given below), and sprinkle with nutmeg, ¼ cup sugar and dot with butter. Cook a 450° until crust is done.
