Aggie Baseballers Clip Sam Houston Here 4-1

Little Doug Mullins hurled four and two-thirds innings of no-hit relief yesterday as unbeaten A&M downed the stubborn Sam Houston State Bearkats, 4-1, on Kyle Field.

Mullins, 5-8 righthander, came onto the scene in the top of the fifth inning with the Aggies holding a slim 2-1 lead, the bases loaded and only one out. He retired the side on four pitches and went on to face but 15 batters in taking credit for his first win of the season.

It was the third straight win of the year for Coach Beau Bell's Cadets, who have only three more games to go before beginning the defense of their Southwest Conference crown.

The Bearkats jumped on starter Dick Munday for a run in the top of the first frame as second baseman Gabe Urbina led off with a double that hugged the left field foul line. Urbina went to second on an error and scored on teammate Bob Kenemer's single.

A&M knotted the score in their half of the initial inning. After two outs, right fielder Phil Newport singled sharply to left and raced home all the way from first on an error.

The final three Aggie runs came on some beautifully executed "double-steals." Captain Joe Borling led off A&M's half of the

fourth with an infield single and went to second on a one-bagger by catcher Sam Smotherman. Borling stole home for the Ags second run, while Smotherman took second base on the play.
