# Feldman Pitches Tigers to 7-0 Win

Looking for win number three of the young season, A&M Consolidated's baseball Tigers move into Madisonville today after bettering their record with an easy, 7-0, victory over the Huntsville Hornets Tuesday on Tiger Field.

The Tigers want a victory today in this return engagement, having lost a tough one to the Mustang crew Monday, 9-6, when Madisonville picked up five runs on only one hit in the sixth.

Edgar Feldman hurled magnificent baseball against the Class AA Huntsville team, giving up only two hits and striking out nine while going the distance. Feldman was never in serious trouble, walking seven in the seven innings he worked.

Centerfielder Bill Kavanaugh opened the third with a free pass to first, moved to second when Alton Arnold walked and came home on Bobby Witcher's clean single. Catcher Steadman Davis blasted a long double, scoring Arnold and Witcher and rode home when Manuel Garcia stroked a one-base blow.




