TUCSON, Ariz.—Jim Busby led off the ninth inning for Cleveland yesterday with his fifth home run of the exhibition season, and that won the Tribe an 8-7 victory over the Baltimore Orioles.

PHOENIX, Ariz.—Don Hoak, Monte Irvin, Harry Chiti and rookie Richie Myers had three hits each yesterday to trigger a 20-hit barrage by the Chicago Cubs in a 13-10 exhibition victory over the New York Giants.

Aggies Off to Fast Start In SWC Baseball Race

Off to a fast start in its drive toward a second straight Southwest Conference championship, A&M's baseball team is currently engaged in a three-way scrap for the loop leadership.

Coach Beau Bell's hustling Aggies turned back previously undefeated SMU on Kyle Field last weekend to join the University of Texas and Texas Christian on the conference's top rung. TCU leads the loop by a half game.

Toby Newton, a sophomore lefthander with blinding speed, expressed his thanks for being allowed to start the conference opener against the Mustangs by tossing a three-hit shut-out. Newton, who fanned 14 of 18 batters to face him in the Texas Lutheran game here last week, stopped the potent Ponies in flawless fashion.

Newton was backed up by an equally flawless infield of first baseman John Hoyle, second sacker Dick Bleckner, shortstop Joe Boring and third baseman Joe Worden. The Cadet infielders played errorless ball while their SMU

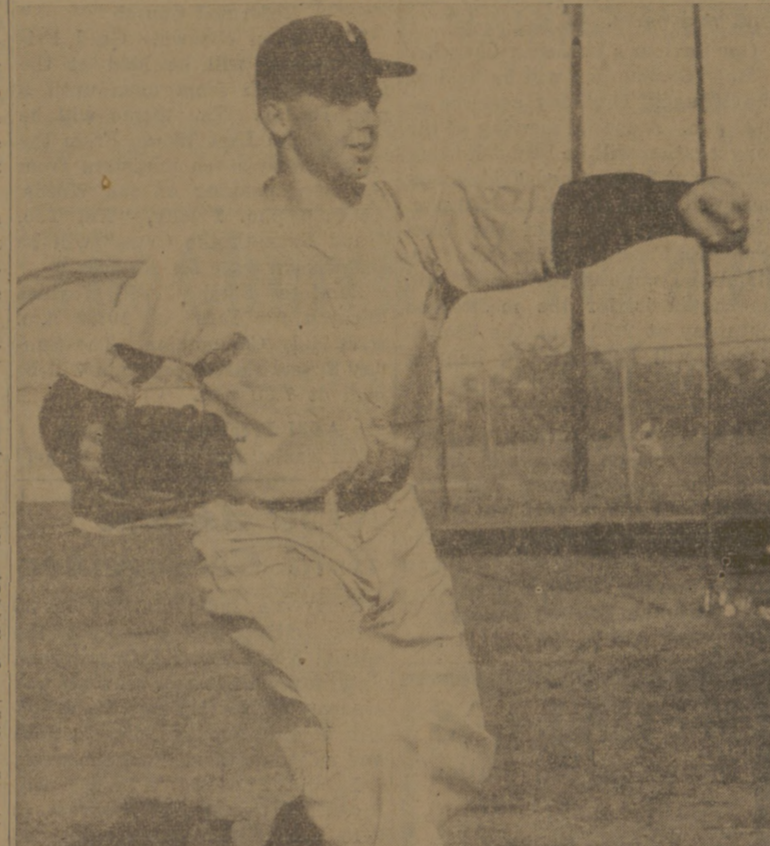
counterparts committed four errors, one which allowed the only run of the ball game.

The Cadets take a rest from conference warfare this week, taking on the pro-Corpus Christi Clippers at Corpus Christi tomorrow and Friday. A&M returns to league action April 3 against Rice's up-and-coming Owls at Houston.

A&M's one-run victory over Coach Alex Hooks' Mustangs marked the fourth successive time the Aggies had beaten the Dallas nine by a single run. Last year the

two teams met three times, and three times the Ags downed the Ponies by one run. Two of last season's games went 11 innings, including the contest at Dallas which gave the Aggies the championship.

The Aggies will carry a season record of five wins and two losses into tomorrow's meeting with the Clippers of Corpus Christi. Two games scheduled here this week against another professional club, the New Orleans Pelicans, were cancelled.

Aggie Pistol Team Tied For Third in Standings

Although A&M's Pistol Team downed both the United States Military Academy and the United States Naval Academy while winning the national pistol title, the Aggies are only tied for third behind the two military academies in the inter-collegiate competition.

The Aggies are 97 points behind leading West Point and 42 behind runner-up Annapolis with the U. S. Merchant Marine Academy in

fifth place and the U. S. Coast Guard Academy in seventh position. At present the fifth and sixth matches have been completed and the entire competition will be over within four weeks.

The matches are run on a "postal system with the targets used by the various teams being mailed to the U. S. Revolver Association where the scores are computed.

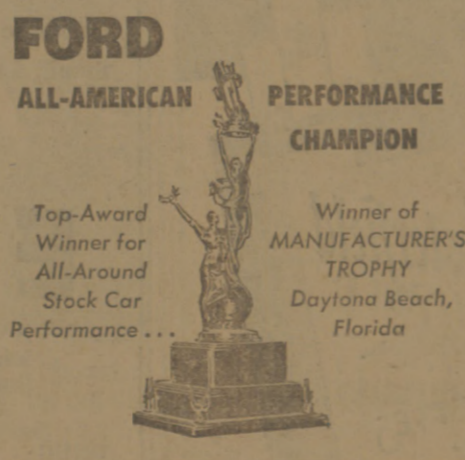

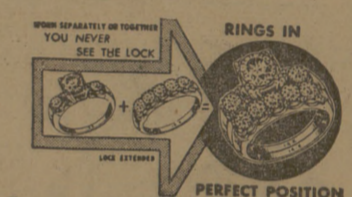
